On the back of decades of experience in Sanskrit education CSU Understands well how Students come in all hues. Any Classroom from elementary to highest level of education has learners who learn at differing speed & abilities. CSU emphasize on identifying slow learners and help them gain speed and recognize advanced learner and help them zoom fast.

Here, slow learner means those who could not keep pace with the classroom teaching and learning needs extra attention to bring such students at par with the rest of students of the class. They will be identified based on their performance in university examination of the Previous Semester internal examination & summative evaluation by subject teacher/class teacher.

Normally, at the beginning of each course teacher assess the learning levels of the students in their class, their knowledge about the course and accordingly special programs for advanced learner & slow learners are planned. Special Remedial & extra classes are conducted for slow learners. After the completion of syllabus subject classes are also repeated for slow learners and late admissions

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem-solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

CSU places a strong focus on student-centric methods for enhancing learning through various methods such as brain storming, group discussions, quiz competitions, presentations and project works and participative learning & problem solving methodologies. Regular Participative activities such as group discussions, projects, educational tours seminars extension lecturers are organized in the various campuses of the CSU & the students are activity participate in these activities within the campus & outside colleges. Students are given individual projects & class assignments for focusing on self study and to encourage independent learning. Different student support systems are available in the CSU campus like Library, computer lab, reading room, ICT based classroom. A large member of Shiksha Shastri students have been presenting their work as posters & medals in campus level.

Beyond the classroom CSU gives high importance to all-round development of students as much as possible in learning procedures that require more than reading or reviewing the material. Students are taken for study tours to the sites of interest in order to get familiar with the field visit experience.

At the departmental level the heads & faculty who are engaged in any class strive to complete the courses in time and in some cases extra classes are conducted for the students who are average in studies. The 75% attendance is mandatory for exam. In CSU the continuous evaluation is done through tests, written assignments, oral presentation so on. The end semester examination of every course is based on written examination of three hours.

Attainment of the programme specific outcomes

The program of specific outcomes is measured by taking the aggregate of all courses in a given program of the individual student and then the average performance of all students in a given program.

3.1 - Promotion of Research and Facilities

3.1.1 - The institution Research facilities are frequently updated and there is well defined policy for promotion of research which is uploaded on the institutional website and implemented

CSU has well established research promotion policy in place there by providing comprehensive information and holistic approach to provide research among its constituent campuses.

The Knowledge emanating from education institutions in the forms of research is widely disseminated in various forms including eminent publications, presentation at conferences, protection through intellectual propriety. CSU has been at the forefront of imparting quality education of Sanskrit in the country. Apart from being an educational institution CSU has laid great emphasis on research advancement in recent years. It has created an ambience for promotion of research out of 435 members of the faculty, 263 are Doctorate holders. There are 200 recognized research guides under CSU.

Research scholars are pursuing their Ph.D. Programs for the promotion of research. Campus level research committee under

guidance of Director promotes research activities. Rooms with computers are provided for research scholars a separate computer networking lab is also available, Software like Ouriginal, Shodha-Shuddi, urkunda etc. are also available.

Plagiarism Software is available in library. These facilities enhance the research ambience among the PG students and research scholars.

Our students received grants under various scholarship schemes such as Rajeev Gandhi SC/ST Scholarship Rs. 25,000/- per months & social welfare scholarship.
