From the Pen of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor....

It is with immense pride and a deep sense of responsibility that I have the privilege of presenting the Annual Report of the Central Sanskrit University, Delhi, for the academic year 2024–2025. This report reflects our steadfast commitment to academic excellence, innovative research, and the preservation, nourishment, development, propagation and dissemination of Sanskrit as a vibrant vehicle of India's rich intellectual heritage.

Following the recommendations of the Sanskrit Commission (1956–57), the Government of India established a Central Sanskrit Board, which recommended the creation of the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan. Accordingly, on 15th October 1970, this institution was established as an autonomous organisation. The Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan was granted Deemed-to-be-University status in 2002 and elevated to the Central Sanskrit University in 2020. It continues to function as the nodal agency of the Government of India for the promotion and propagation of Sanskrit, while conducting innovative research to advance India's profound Sanskrit heritage and Indian Knowledge System.

In addition to its headquarters in New Delhi, the University today operates 12 campuses across various states of the country and the IKS-EDS Centre at Deccan College, Pune. It also oversees the administrative and financial management of 26 Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Shodh Sansthanas under the Central Scheme, while serving as the affiliating body for 184 institutions dedicated to Sanskrit education.

Guided by our University's motto - “योऽनुचानः स नो महान्” (He who is well-versed in learning is truly great) we remain firmly convinced that true education imparts not only knowledge but also संस्कार (values and refinement), devotion, and a spirit of commitment. Under the inspiring leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi ji and with the visionary guidance of Hon'ble Minister of Education and Chancellor, Shri Dharmendra Pradhan ji, the University is progressing towards creating citizens endowed with comprehensive Indian knowledge traditions, modern scientific and technological competence, multilingual ability, critical and reflective thinking, ethical values and national commitment.

The University has wholeheartedly embraced the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. While maintaining dedicated campuses for traditional learning, we are steadily integrating our curriculum to promote interdisciplinary learning, blend traditional Indian knowledge with modern disciplines, foster critical thinking, and ensure the holistic development of students.

Building on our previous accomplishments - including the A++ grade accreditation by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and recognition as a Category-I University by the University Grants Commission (UGC) this year has been marked by several significant milestones:

1. Introduction of new multidisciplinary programmes in line with NEP 2020, including M.A. (Indian Knowledge System), LL.B (Hons.) in Bharatiya Jurisprudence program, B.A. Hons. (Sanskrit & Civil Services Studies), and B.Sc./M.Sc. (Yogic Science), with plans to introduce more interdisciplinary courses in the coming years.

2. Establishment and strengthening of specialised centres, including the Centre for Indian Knowledge System and Encyclopaedic Dictionary of Sanskrit (IKS-EDS) at Deccan College, Pune.
3. Establishing Faculty Development Centres in three campuses to promote innovative teaching pedagogies integrated with technology.
4. Expansion of the मुक्त स्वाध्याय पीठम् (Mukt Swadhyaya Peetham) now offering UG, PG, Diploma, and Certificate programmes to nearly 12,000 students from 26 countries. Additionally, Sanskrit learning centres have been established in various IIITs, IITs, IIMs, and many central and state universities.
5. Promotion of innovative academic and cultural activities such as MOOCs courses, skill development programmes including Workshop for Course Creators on NSQF guidelines under प्राच्यविद्याकौशलविकासपरिषद्, Sanskrit Olympiad, Gita Olympiad, All India Youth Festival, Sanskrit Saptah Mahotsav, Students reaching Chandrakhani Pass Trek, and observance of national programmes like International Yoga Day (21 June 2024), Independence Day, Bharatiya Bhasha Diwas, Hindi Pakhwada, Vigilance week and Swachhata Saptah and many more.
7. Special initiatives included programmes on Promotion of Leadership and Decision-Making Roles for Women at the Workplace.
8. Strengthening international collaborations through programmes such as the Nepal Bharata Sanskrit Sammelan, Kathmandu (27th–29th March 2024); the International Conference on ‘Economy, Ecology and Equity in the light of Dharmic Principles: Triple E & D, Culture Conservation and Sustainable Development’ in Singapore (27th–30th May 2024); the Sanskrit Conference in Australia (2024); and academic visits and conferences in Thailand (2025).
9. Entered into 9 MoUs with reputed institutions such as IIT Hyderabad, IGNCA, New Delhi, Fo Guang University, Taiwan, HCLTech, and Academia Vivarium Novum, Italy. These collaborations focus on interdisciplinary research, digital and technological applications, and international academic exchange, thereby strengthening CSU’s academic outreach and global engagement.
10. Advancing plans for the formation of a Section-8 company to support innovative initiatives.
11. Strengthened infrastructure through the up gradation of academic facilities, classrooms, hostels, libraries, and digital resources across its campuses, thereby improving teaching–learning environments and student support services.

These accomplishments have been made possible through significant contribution of dedicated contributions of faculty, officers and staff. Many innovative projects have been initiated in collaboration with government and non-government institutions.

I express my profound gratitude to the Hon'ble Minister of Education for his invaluable guidance and to the Secretary (Higher Education) along with all officers of the Ministry for their continued support for achieving our shared vision.

Embracing the ancient prayers 'सर्वे भवन्तु सुखिनः' and 'वसुधैव कुटुम्बकम्,' we are committed to position India as Viśvaguru through global dissemination of our timeless knowledge.

1. AN OVERVIEW

1.1. The Institution

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, was established by the Govt. of India in the year 1970 as per the recommendations of Sanskrit Commission, 1956. Its main aim & objective was to promote, propagate and preserve Sanskrit learning, teaching and research throughout the country. It was fully funded by the Ministry of HRD (now Ministry of Education), Govt. of India.

Considering its contribution in the field of promotion and propagation of traditional Sanskrit education, the Government of India accorded it the status of Deemed to be University w.e.f. 7th May, 2002. The erstwhile Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, (Deemed to be University) has now been promulgated as Central Sanskrit University, Delhi (CSU) under the Central Sanskrit Universities Act, 2020 (No.5 of 2020) passed by the Parliament and assented to by His Excellency, the President of India and started functioning as the Central Sanskrit University, Delhi since 30th April, 2020. With its Headquarters at New Delhi, it has twelve campuses spread across the country. In addition to these constituent campuses, it has granted affiliation to 58 Sanskrit institutions established in different regions of the Country.

Besides, it is also working as the nodal agency of Govt. of India for overall promotion of Sanskrit language and was entrusted with implementation of following Central Schemes for development of Sanskrit education:-

1. Presidential Awards for Certificate of Honour and Maharishi Badarayana Vyas Samman to the Scholars in Sanskrit, Pali, Prakrit, Arabic, Persian, Classical Kannada, Classical Telugu, Classical Malayalam and Classical Odia languages.
2. Scheme for Financial Assistance to the institutions recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya/Adarsh Shodha Sansthan.
3. Financial Assistance to Voluntary Sanskrit Organizations.
4. Financial Assistance for Sanskrit Teaching.
5. Pali-Prakrit Scheme.
6. Financial Assistance to NGOs/Deemed Sanskrit Universities/CBSE/NCERT/SCERT for various Research Projects and Programmes/ Activities for promotion of Sanskrit.
7. Financial Assistance for Publication/Re-print of rare books and Bulk Purchase of Books.
8. Financial Assistance to Registered Academic Organisations to conduct "Vocational Training Courses" to the students of Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/Institutions.
9. Financial Assistance for award of Scholarship to students of Sanskrit Pathashalas/ Mahavidyalayas/Secondary/Higher Secondary Schools/Colleges/Universities under the scheme for Development of Sanskrit Education.
10. All India Sanskrit Elocution Contest (Akhil Bhartiya Shastriya Spardha).
11. Financial Assistance for Utilization of services of retired/ eminent literary Sanskrit Scholars (Shastra Chudamani).
12. Financial Assistance for Samman Rashi to Eminent Sanskrit Pandits in indigent circumstances.
13. Sanskrit Dictionary Project, Deccan College, Punc.
14. Financial Assistance under Ashtaadashi (18) Projects for sustaining growth of Sanskrit).

Under these schemes, financial assistance is provided to institutions/organizations/ scholars. Engaged in propagation and development of Sanskrit throughout the country.

1.2 Role and functions

The major objectives of the Central Sanskrit University as indicated in the Memorandum of Association are to propagate, develop and encourage Sanskrit learning and research and in pursuance thereof –

1. To Provide for higher education leading to excellence and innovations in such branches of knowledge as may be deemed fit primarily at post-graduate and research degree levels fully conforming to the concept of university, namely University Education Report (1948) and the Report of the Committee on Renovation and Rejuvenation of Higher Education in India (2009) and the Report of the Review Committee for Deemed to be Universities (2009).
2. To engage in areas of specialization with proven ability to make distinctive contributions to the objectives of the university education system that is academic engagement clearly distinguishable from programmes of an ordinary nature that lead to conventional degrees in arts, science, engineering, medicine, dental, pharmacy, management, etc. routinely offered by conventional institutions.
3. To provide for high quality teaching and research and for the advancement of knowledge and its dissemination through various research programmes undertaken in-house by substantial number of full-time faculty/research scholars (Ph.D and Post Doctoral) in diverse disciplines.
4. To enable creation of University under the 'de novo' category devoted to unique in emerging areas of knowledge, not being pursued by conventional or existing institutions - particularly in specific areas of study and research preferably sponsored by the Government of a State/UT or the Central Government regarded as important for strategic needs of the country or for the preservation of our cultural heritage, so determined by a well laid-out process of wide consultation with the eminent peers of academic community.
5. To undertake, aid, promote, coordinate research in all branches of Sanskrit learning including teachers' training and manuscriptology, to bring out linkage with the outcome of modern research in the contextually relevant fields and to bring out publications.
6. To act as nodal agency for the Government of India to implement its policies and programmes for the development of Sanskrit.
7. To provide for instruction and training in such branches of learning as it may deem fit.
8. To provide for research and for the advancement of/and dissemination of knowledge.
9. To undertake extra mural studies, extension programmes and field outreach activities to contribute to the development of society.
10. To do all such other acts and things as may be necessary or desirable to further the objectives of the University.

1.3 Programmes and Activities

Realising its objectives, the University has undertaken the following major programmes and activities:-

- Establishment of Campuses in different States of India.
- Conducting teaching of Sanskrit on traditional lines at Secondary/Under-graduate, Graduate, Post-graduate and Research at Doctorate levels.

- Conducting teachers training at graduate level i.e. Shiksha-Shastri (B. Ed.) and Post graduate level ie. Shiksha Acharya (M.Ed.).
- Conducting and Co-ordinating research work in various disciplines of Sanskrit.
- Co-operating with other organisations in sponsoring joint projects of common interest.
- Establishment of Sanskrit libraries, Manuscripts' collection centres and also editing and publishing rare manuscripts and books of Importance.
- Conferment of degrees and granting of diplomas/certificates to persons having satisfactorily completed the approved prescribed courses of study/research and passed prescribed examinations, Instituting and awarding visitorship, fellowship, scholarships, stipends, prizes and medals.
- Conducting distance education programmes.
- Implementation of schemes of the Ministry of Education for the promotion of Sanskrit.

1.4 Teaching

Teaching is conducted from Prak-Shastri to Acharya levels on the basis of syllabus drawn up by the University in its 12 Campuses. The affiliated institutions carry out teaching from Prathama to Acharya.

Sanskrit institutions managed by voluntary organisations and affiliated to the University also impart teaching with the same syllabus.

1.5 Teachers' Training

In the Campuses, teacher's training course of one academic year with emphasis on teaching practice, is conducted leading to the award of Shiksha-Shastri Degree which is equivalent to B.Ed.. In addition, Shiksha-Acharya Degree course equivalent to M.Ed. is conducted in Jaipur and Bhopal Campuses.

1.6 Research

In all the Campuses of the University, students are enrolled for carrying out research leading to the award of degree of Vidyavaridhi, which is equivalent to Ph.D.

However, Ganga Nath Jha Campus, Prayagraj is exclusively dedicated to research activities in selected branches of Sanskrit. The Library of the Campus is one of the richest Sanskrit Libraries in the country. A collection of over 57,957 rare manuscripts are also preserved in the library.

1.7 Publications

The Central Sanskrit University has been publishing around 40 research journals containing research-based articles from its publication wing of the Headquarter and from other campuses. Prominent journals are as follow:-

1. Sanskrit Vimarsha is an UGC-CARE listed Peer-Reviewed International Research Journal published by University's Headquarter half yearly.
2. Journal of the Ganganath Jha Campus is also an UGC-CARE listed Peer-Reviewed Research Journal published by Ganganath Jha Campus, Prayagraj Annually.
3. Shikshamritam is also an UGC-CARE listed Peer-Reviewed Research Journal published by Shri Ranbir Campus, Jammu Annually.
4. Gomati: A Journal for Indological Research is also an UGC-CARE listed Peer-Reviewed Research Journal published by Lucknow Campus, Lucknow Annually And others.

The campuses also upgraded the annual magazines published by them as research journals. The University as well as the Campuses have brought out scholarly works, rare manuscripts and original texts. The University has published more than 700 titles from its publication wing of the Headquarter and from other campuses published so far. Sanskrit Varta a quarterly news bulletin in Sanskrit is also being published regularly.

1.8 Rajbhasha Prabhat

The Ministry has been successfully running a programme called Rajbhasha Prabhat for the promotion and dissemination of Hindi language in the Central Government offices. In this sequence, a sufficient number of official work and various programmes are being conducted by university through Hindi Language. Apart from other activities, report of the work being done in Hindi is sent to the Ministry every three months.

2. AUTHORITIES & STRUCTURE

2.1 Smt. Droupadi Murmu, Hon'ble President of India is the **Visitor** of the Central Sanskrit University. **Shri Dharmendra Pradhan, Hon'ble Minister, Ministry of Education, Government of India** held the position of the **Chancellor** of the University. The **Vice-Chancellor** is the principal academic & executive officer and the ex-officio **Chairperson** of all statutory bodies of the University. The Vice-Chancellor exercises general supervision and control over the affairs of the University, executes policies and programmes and implements the decisions of all its authorities. **Prof. Shrinivasa Varakhedi** was the Vice Chancellor of Central Sanskrit University during 01.04.2024 to 31.03.2025. The following are the authorities of the University:

- Court** - Constitution of the court and powers of the court shall be as prescribed by the clause 20 of the Central Sanskrit University Act. 2020.
- Executive Council** - It is the principal body to manage the University. It is empowered to take policy decisions and to ensure implementation of the decisions.
- Academic Council** - It is the principal academic body, responsible for the maintenance of standards of education, teaching, training, examinations and research programme.
- Board of Studies** – Each Department shall have Board of Studies. The functions of a Board of Studies shall be to approve subjects for research for various degree and other requirements of research degree and recommend to the concerned School Board in the manner prescribed by the Ordinances.
- Finance Committee** - It is the apex finance body responsible for placing annual accounts and financial estimates before the Board of Management, fixing limits of total expenditure and recommending creation of all types of posts.
- Planning and Monitoring Board** - It is the principal planning body responsible for monitoring of development programmes of the University.

Apart from the above, the University has also other constituted bodies namely Grant-in-Aid Committee, Publication Committee, Building Committee, Scholarship Selection Committee, Research Board and Examination Board for making recommendations to their respective nature of functions.



❖ **Saṁskṛtavimarśa**

Saṁskṛtavimarśa is a prestigious biannual, trilingual, peer-reviewed, and open-access research journal published by the Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi. The number of its readers and subscribers has now reached nearly one thousand. All academic officers and faculty members

of the University are enrolled as readers and subscribers of this journal. The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor serves as the Chief Editor of the journal. Under his direct guidance, the journal regularly publishes special issues related to the Indian Knowledge Tradition. It is now available entirely as an Open Access Journal. On 13 June 2024, the 24th issue of the journal was released, which also featured a research article written in Sanskrit by a foreign research student. Subsequently, the 25th issue was released on 13 January 2025, during the National Youth Day closing ceremony. This issue was published as a Special Issue (Part-1) on the Indian Knowledge Tradition, containing a total of 36 research papers. Being open access, this issue is easily available to readers around the world. The 26th issue was launched at the "Utkarsh Mahotsav" organized at the Nashik Campus. This issue included 11 Sanskrit, 7 Hindi, and 11 English high-quality research papers, and it was widely appreciated as an outstanding publication. The journal's Editor is Acharya Ganesh Timmanna Pandit, Joint Director of the Publication Department. Research Assistant Ayushman Shreesha Sameera and Technical Associate Ms. Nishika Pawar played a significant role in the preparation of the journal. Because eminent scholars from various universities and institutions across India have been included in the Advisory and Evaluation Committee, the journal is now being published very smoothly, systematically, and regularly.

❖ **Sanskritavārtā**

The Publication Department also publishes the quarterly newsletter *Sanskritavārtā*, which compiles and presents reports on various programs and activities organized by the Central Sanskrit University, its constituent campuses, and Model Colleges/Research Centres.

The main responsibility of the Examination Section is to organize examinations and to declare results of the examinations of regular courses conducted by Central Sanskrit University, Delhi as Poorva Madhyama, Uttar Madhyama, Prak-shastri, Shastri, Shastri Pratishttha, B.Sc., Shikshashastri, Acharya, M.A., M.Sc., Shikshacharya and Vidyavaridhi and other certificate, diploma, PG diploma etc. and courses conducted by Muktaswadhyayapeetham as Prak-shastri Setu, Shastri Setu, Acharya Setu, Prak-shastri, Shastri and Acharya. These examinations are conducted according to the guidelines laid down by the Examination Board and Academic Council.

4.1.6 LIBRARY

Library as Learning Resource Centre

Libraries are the heart of academic institutions, serving as a repository of knowledge and a hub for supporting the academic and research activities of the University. Our distinguished library system, comprising 13 campuses spread across different parts of India, is well-known for its invaluable collections of manuscripts, rare books, and other unique resources. It acts as a learning resource centre for the CSU fraternity.

Each campus library has an extensive collection of Sanskrit Literature in both traditional and modern disciplines, such as Veda, Vyakaran, Vedanta, Sahitya, Sankhya, Yoga, Darshan, Nyaya, Jyotisha, Dharmashastra, Tantra, Purana, Sanskrit Literature, Education, Law (Vidhishastra), and Modern Subjects. CSU Library caters to the information needs of the faculty members, students, research scholars and staffs.

Currently, the CSU Library is utilizing the e-Granthalaya 4.0 Version Learning Management System (LMS) developed by the National Informatics Centre (NIC) for its housekeeping operations. The library is a member of the Developing Library Network (DELNET). The library has also become a member of INFLIBNET, which is an Inter-University Centre of the University Grants Commission under the Ministry of Education. Under the ShodhShuddhi Program, the library offers faculty members and research scholar's access to Drill Bit-Extreme 'Plagiarism Detection Software' to check for plagiarism and improve the quality of their research.

Library Collection:

Currently, the CSU library system has a valuable collection of approximately 4,15,500+ print volumes, 57,100+ manuscripts, 5200+ theseses and dissertations, 160+ journals and 10,200+ newspapers. In addition, CSU campus libraries also have 63 computers.

During Fiscal Year 2024-2025, 3000+ print books were added, and INR 30,14,130 was spent on print books procurement until March 31, 2024.

Approximately 60,187 volumes were issued to users across campuses until March 31, 2023, and a total of 1,13,102 walk-ins (visitor's count of students and faculty) were recorded across campus libraries during the said fiscal year.

Library Services and Facilities

The library offers a diverse array of services to its patrons:

Library Events and Activities

During FY 2024-2025, following events and activities organized:

1. World Book and Copyright Day 2024

The World Book and Copyright Day 2024 were organized on April 23, 2024, at 4:00 PM at the Headquarters, New Delhi, in collaboration with the Publication Division. The theme for the year, "Read Your Way," highlighted the joy and inspiration derived from reading and emphasized its enduring significance in personal and intellectual growth.

Prof. Shrinivasa Varakhedi, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi, graced the occasion as the Chief Guest, while Dr. Priya Rai, University Librarian, National Law University Delhi, was the Guest of Honour.

2. National Conference

"A Two-Day National Conference on Revamping Academic Libraries in the Context of NEP 2020: Prospects and Challenges" organized on October 17th and 18th, 2024, at Central Sanskrit University, Vedavyas Campus, Balahar, Himachal Pradesh.

3. National Symposium

A Three-Day Symposium on "**Transforming Sanskrit Libraries in the Context of NEP 2020 for Viksit Bharat @2047**" was organized in collaboration with the Indira Gandhi National

Centre for the Arts (IGNCA), New Delhi, from March 26–28, 2025, at the Samvet Auditorium, IGNCA, Janpath, New Delhi.

This first-of-its-kind symposium was exclusively designed for library professionals from Sanskrit universities and institutions across India. It aimed to bring them together to exchange best practices, enhance professional skills, and collectively envision the transformation of Sanskrit libraries in alignment with the national vision of *Viksit Bharat @2047*.

Inauguration Ceremony

The Inauguration Ceremony commenced with the traditional *Deep Prajjwalan*, *Sanskrit Mantra Ucharan*, *Tulsi Poojan*, and the CSU *Kulgeet*, followed by a formal welcome of the dignitaries on the dais.

Dr. P. M. Gupta, University Librarian, Central Sanskrit University (CSU), and Symposium Convener, delivered the welcome address. Prof. (Dr.) R. C. Gaur, Director & Head, Kala Nidhi, and Dean (Administration), IGNCA, and Chair of the Symposium, delivered the opening address, highlighting the significance of the event that brought together over 400 participants, including Sanskrit scholars and LIS professionals from across the nation.

Prof. Santishree Dhulipudi Pandit, Vice-Chancellor, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, the Guest of Honour, in her inaugural address, emphasized libraries as centers of *dharma* and cultural continuity, urging librarians to engage with Sanskrit and contribute to restoring India's knowledge heritage.

Dr. Sachchidanand Joshi, Member Secretary, IGNCA, who presided over the ceremony, stressed the role of libraries in preserving the nation's knowledge treasure and proposed a short-term Sanskrit diploma program for library professionals.

The Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi, conferred various national-level awards to eminent contributors in the field of Library and Information Science and Sanskrit knowledge preservation.

Prof. Shrinivasa Varakhedi, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Central Sanskrit University, and Chief Patron of the Symposium, presented the following awards in recognition of their distinguished contributions:

Shri Shankaranand B. R., National Organizing Secretary, Bharatiya Shikshan Mandal, delivered an insightful address on *Drishti Parivartan*—transforming vision to transform behavior—and emphasized the role of libraries in sustaining India's cultural and intellectual traditions.

The ceremony concluded with closing remarks by Prof. Varakhedi and a vote of thanks by Shri Naveen Dobriyal. The symposium featured six keynote addresses, 24 invited talks, 11 technical sessions, and panel discussions, marking a milestone collaboration between Sanskrit scholars and

library professionals nationwide. There were 15 chairs and co-chairs, 24 Speakers, various panelists, and discussants during the Symposium.

4.1.7 SALES UNIT

The Sales Unit, located at the University Headquarters in Janakpuri, New Delhi, functions as the distribution gateway for all publications of the Central Sanskrit University, ensuring their outreach to the general public. This unit forms an active component of the University's Publication Department, which not only manages the sale and distribution of books but also serves as a vital bridge in promoting and disseminating India's Knowledge Traditions.

The primary objective of the Sales Division is to make available the University's high-quality publications - including classical texts, textbooks, research compilations, and various academic resources - to readers across India and abroad.

Major Activities of the Sales Division

1. Operation of the Headquarters Sales Centre:

Efficient management of the Sales Centre situated at the University Headquarters for the sale and distribution of University publications.

2. Distribution Network:

Supplying books and publications to various campuses and their recognized sales outlets to ensure the availability of University publications at all centres.

3. Participation in Book Fairs:

Representing the University at book fairs and literary exhibitions organized across the country to promote and popularize Sanskrit literature and enhance sales.

4. Expansion of Public Accessibility:

Facilitating easy and transparent access to University publications through its website, online portals, and other institutional platforms.

5. Promotion and Public Awareness:

Contributing to the dissemination of the invaluable heritage of Indian Knowledge Systems - including culture, philosophy, science, grammar, literature, education, and yoga - through the sale and circulation of books.

Summary

The Sales Division of the Central Sanskrit University plays a pivotal role in promoting and propagating the Indian Knowledge Tradition through the sale and distribution of the University's diverse publications.

It serves not merely as a sales mechanism but as a "medium of knowledge dissemination", actively contributing to the global outreach of Sanskrit texts and scholarship.

4.1.8 SCHEME SECTION

The section is responsible for implementing following Central Schemes transferred from the Ministry of Education, Government of India for Schemes for Sanskrit Promotion :-

1. Financial Assistance for Sanskrit Teaching. (Annexure-I)

Financial Assistance for Sanskrit teachers to the Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas.

Under this scheme, selected organizations are being sanctioned financial assistance in the form of remuneration to Sanskrit teachers @Rs. 20,000/- per month 12 months in a year, for Part-time Teachers/Computer Teacher @ Rs. 10,000/- per month for 12 months in a year.

An amount of Rs. 2263.18 lakh was issued under this scheme by the Central Sanskrit University, Delhi during the financial year 2024-25. Financial assistance was provided to 834 Sanskrit teachers who are working in 394 Sanskrit Pathshalas/Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas.

Financial Assistance for Teachers for Modern Subject in Traditional Sanskrit Pathasalas/Mahavidyalayas.

Under this scheme, selected organizations are being sanctioned financial assistance in the form of remuneration to Modern Subject teachers @Rs. 20,000/- per month 12 months in a year, for Part-time Teachers/Computer Teacher @ Rs. 10,000/- per month for 12 months in a year.

An amount of Rs. 708.96 lakh was issued under this scheme by the Central Sanskrit University, Delhi during the financial year 2024-25. Financial assistance was provided to 305 Modern Subject teachers who are working in 205 Sanskrit Pathshalas/Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas.

Financial Assistance for Sanskrit teachers for Secondary/Higher Secondary Schools belonging to State Government Schools.

Under the scheme financial assistance is being provided to one Sanskrit teacher @Rs. 20,000/- per month for 12 months engaged in Government High/Higher Secondary Schools where the State Government is not able to provide Sanskrit Teaching facilities to do so.

Under this Scheme, during the financial year 2024-25 a total number of 10 Sanskrit teachers working at Government Schools were the beneficiaries and an amount of Rs. 10.06 lakh was utilized.

d) Financial Assistance for Sanskrit teachers under Guru Sishya Parampra Institutions (registered Chatuspathi/Gurukulas/Pathshalas/Tolls/Guru Sishya Parampra traditional Institutions).

Under this scheme financial assistance is being provided to Sanskrit Teachers who are working in Guru Sishya Parampra Institutions (registered Chatuspathi/ Gurukulas/Pathshalas/Tolls/

Guru Sishya Parampra traditional Institutions) with remuneration of @Rs. 5,000/- per month for 12 months.

Under this Scheme, during the financial year 2024-25 a total number of Nil Sanskrit teachers working at Nil Chatuspathi/ Gurukulas/Pathshalas/ Tolls/ Guru Sishya Parampra traditional Institutions Institutions were the beneficiaries and an amount of Rs. Nil was utilized.

Financial Assistance for Residential maintenance of traditional/oriental Sanskrit students for providing lunch and dinner facilities to the residential students.

Under this scheme, selected organizations having residential facilities are being sanctioned financial assistance in the form of Residential maintenance Scholarship for providing lunch and dinner facilities to the residential traditional/oriental Sanskrit students @ Rs. 600/- per month for 10 months in an academic year.

Under this Scheme, during the financial year 2024-25 a total number of 4749 residential students were the beneficiaries and an amount of Rs. 284.94 lakh was utilized.

II Financial Assistance for Samman Rashi to Eminent Sanskrit Pandits in indigent circumstances.

Under the scheme the financial assistance is provided in the form of Samman Rashi to the Eminent Sanskrit Scholars above the age of 65 years. Who have dedicated their lives to Sanskrit but have no settled source of income. The selected scholars will be given @ Rs. 60,000/- per annum, without deduction of income from other sources. Total 155 numbers of pandits are being benefitted through this scheme. An amount of Rs. 92.88 lakh released under this scheme by the University.

III Financial Assistance for Programmes/Activities for Promotion of Sanskrit.

Under this scheme, Central Sanskrit University, Delhi meets cent-percent approved expenditure on different programmes for the development and propagation of Sanskrit undertaken by NGO's/Sanskrit Universities/Universities Institutions. During the year 2024-25 an amount of Rs. 40.00 lakh has been sanctioned in favor of 16 Institutions/Universities/NGO's. The University incurred an expenditure of Rs. 14.91 lakh for various activities.

IV Financial Assistance for Utilization of services of Eminent or Retired Sanskrit Scholars (Shastra Chudamani).

Under this Scheme, the services of Eminent or Retired Sanskrit Scholars are being utilized in Traditional Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Universities and voluntary organizations. The main objective of the scheme is to preserve the in-depth studies of different Shastras at the various centers where Sanskrit education is imparted to the Sanskrit students with traditional system. As per the Scheme, the traditional scholars are appointed in different organizations. The scholars are being paid @Rs. 20,000/- per month for a period of two years. The appointment can be extended for another one year on the recommendation of the Grants in Aid Committee.

The University incurred an expenditure of Rs. 42.70 lakh for 44 engaged Shastra Chudamani Scholars for the financial year 2024-25.

V Financial Assistance to registered Academic Organisations to conduct "Vocational Training Courses" to the students of Traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/Institutions.

Under this scheme, selected organizations are issued financial assistance upto @Rs. 1,00,000/- for each programme to organize the workshop and to conduct Fashion Design, Management, Temple Culture, Natural Language Process, Hotel Management, Paaka Shastra (food making), Cultivation, Apps, Tourism, Hospitality, MOOC Development, Manuscriptology, Cataloguing and Proof Reading, Epigraphy and Ratna Pariksha Courses etc..

During the year 2024-25 an amount of Rs. 15.00 lakh has been sanctioned in favor of 08 Sanskrit Vidyalayas/Mahavidyalayas. The University incurred an expenditure of Rs. 25.38 lakh for various courses.

Financial Assistance for Publication of Sanskrit Book, Sanskrit Journals/Patrika, Re-print of Rare Sanskrit books and Bulk Purchase.

The objective of the scheme is to encourage the authors/publishers in the field of Sanskrit for creation of Sanskrit Literature and Journals for propagation and preservation of Sanskrit language by providing the financial assistance. This would also ensure the availability of Sanskrit books and journals in all libraries of Sanskrit institutions. Under these Schemes, the proposals and expenditure details have been sanctioned for the year 2025-26 with a total cost of 1,77,92,797/- (Rupees One Crore Seventy-Seven Lakh Ninety-Two Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety-Seven Only) as follows:

1.1 Publication of Sanskrit Books:-

Pali and Prakrit

The 'Pali-Prakrit Yojana' started in the year 2009 on the initiative of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, has become an integral part of the schemes implemented by the Central Sanskrit University, Delhi after the Five-Year Plan. Looking into the importance of Pali and Prakrit languages Government of India has now given the classical status to

both these languages. In this connection, under this scheme, more than ten books and two journals have been published in the year 2024-25. Beyond this, seminars, workshops and other activities were completed in Lucknow and Jaipur centers. Furthermore, 21-day programme in Tamil Nadu was conducted. Moreover, an international Pali seminar also was conducted in February 2025 with the cooperation of the Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi Headquarters.

Ashtaadashi Project

Ministry of Human Resource Development (now Ministry of Education), Govt. of India, Department of Higher Education vide letter No. F.No. 1-27/2015. Skt. II dated 18.11.2015 had constituted a Committee comprising 13 members under the Chairmanship of Shri N. Gopalaswamy, Chancellor, formerly Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha (now National Sanskrit University), Tirupati to suggest a long-term Vision and Roadmap for next ten years for the development of Sanskrit. As per terms of references, one of the major recommendations of the Committee is Ashtaadashi (18 Projects) for sustaining the growth of Sanskrit. According to the report, Ashtaadashi Scheme may be taken up as a special case in order to give the much-required boost for the growth engine of Sanskrit.

The major areas of the Ashtaadashi project are:

2. Editing & Publishing of Manuscripts Project.
3. Digital & Online Resources Project.
4. Summer Course Project.
5. Contemporary Literature Project.
6. Evening School Project.
7. Technology Adaptation Project.

9. Biennial Sanskrit Book fair Project.
10. Outreach Programs Project.
11. Shabdashala Project.
12. Reprinting of Rare Books Project.
13. Residential Training Project.
14. Integrating Sanskrit with Modern Subjects Project.
15. Support Internship Project.
16. Children's Literature Project.
17. Yoga through Sanskrit Project.
18. Ayurveda through Sanskrit.

The Central Sanskrit University had issued a notification for inviting proposals for providing financial assistance to academic institutions/NGOs in the year 2024-25. According to the notification and recommendations of pre-scrutiny committee, a total number of 218 proposals were called for interface meeting for presentation. Based on the guidelines, quality of the proposals and presentation of the concerned projects, the High-level Committee has recommended 89 projects at a cost of Rs.6,08,41,000/- (Rupees six crore eight lakh and forty-one thousand only). Further, after approval of the GIAC, allocated grants are being disbursed according to guidelines.

4.1.9 SCHOLARSHIP SECTION

Central Sanskrit University disburses two types of scholarships -

- (1) Internal scholarships for Traditional Sanskrit students studying in University's own campuses.
- (2) Financial Assistance for Award of Scholarship to students of Sanskrit Pathashalas/ Mahavidyalayas/ High/Higher Secondary Schools/Colleges at All India Level in Modern and Traditional Streams.

Among the above mentioned 1 & 2 the type 1 scholarship (i.e. internal scholarship for the campus students) are directly distributed to the eligible students by the Campuses. Type 2 scholarships are distributed under the 'Scheme for the Development of Sanskrit Education of Govt. of India. The disbursement of scholarships under this scheme is looked after by the scholarship section of H.Q. of University.

Internal (Type 1) Scholarships

The rates of internal scholarships for students of Prak Shastri, Shastri, Shiksha Shastri and Acharya courses are Rs. 600/- Rs. 800/-, Rs. 800/- and Rs. 1000/- per month respectively. Scholars pursuing research for the award of Vidyavaridhi degree are granted monthly scholarship amount of Rs. 8000/- in addition to annual contingency grant of Rs. 10000/- for two years w.e.f. 18.02.2016.

In order to encourage the students in **Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit**, the scholarship is provided by the Central Sanskrit University, Delhi under the Schemes for Sanskrit Promotionto students regularly studying Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit as a main or optional subject in any recognized Sanskrit Pathashala/Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya/ Sanskrit Vishwavidyalaya in **Traditional Stream** or School/College/ University in **Modern Stream** pursuing Purva-Madhyama(1st year)/9th standard, Purva-Madhyama (2nd year)/10th standard, Uttar-Madhyama/Prakshastri (1st year)/11th standard, Uttar-Madhyama/ Prak-shastri (2nd year)/12th standard, Shastri /B.A (1st/2nd/3rd year), Acharya/ M.A(1st/2nd year), Vidyawaridhi/Ph.D. or equivalent.The rates of Scholarship are as under:-

38557 online applications were received in Traditional and Modern stream from 1612 registered institutions for award of Scholarships for the year 2024-2025 under the Scheme for Sanskrit Promotion.

As per the sanctioned budget earmarked for states, a cut off list of maximum to maximum percentage of student was prepared. 4.1.10 ALL INDIA SANSKRIT ELOCUTION CONTEST

Central Sanskrit University organizes All India Sanskrit Shastriya Competition every year to encourage talented students who study in Sanskrit Universities, traditional Sanskrit Pathashalas and Gurukulas. In order to select eligible participants for National level Competitions, Central Sanskrit University organizes State Level Competitions also in various states on similar line.

4.1.11 ADARSH SANSKRIT MAHAVIDYALAYS/ ADARSH SANSKRIT SHODH SANSTHANS

Name of the Scheme :

The Scheme for Financial Assistance to Institution Recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas/Adarsh Sanskrit Shodh Sansthans.

Introduction :

The Scheme for financial assistance to institution recognized as Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas /Adarsh Sanskrit Shodha Sansthans was started by the Government of India in the year 1976 for supporting traditional institutions of Sanskrit learning. The Scheme was first revised in 1983 vide Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India letter no. F.80-7/88-Sk.I dated 06.10.1983. Then it was revised in 1993 vide Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India letter no. F.30-19/88-SK.I dated 06 July 1993. Later the Scheme was transferred to the Central Sanskrit University (Formerly Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan) for implementation Vide letter no. F.8-3/94-SK-I dated 16.06.1995 of the Department of Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. Thereafter, this Scheme was revised by Government of India, vide letter No. F.No.31-4/2009-Skt.I dated 29 June, 2012. This Scheme has been further revised and approved by the Ministry of Education; Govt. of India vide letter F.No. 1-5/2017-Skt.I (Vol.III) dated 24th March, 2023 with subsequent clarifications vide letter F.No. 1-5/2017-Skt.I (Vol.III) dated 12.06.2023.

The review and revision of the Present Scheme are effected based on the fresh developments that have taken place on account of receipt of suggestions/grievance petitions relating to the guidelines of the Scheme, issuance of University Grants Commission (UGC) Regulations 2018, conversion of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed to be University) into a Central Sanskrit University, Delhi, implementation of the recommendations contained in NEP-2020 etc..

Under this scheme, 26 Institutions are being run at various parts of the country with the financial assistance of Govt. of India through the Central Sanskrit University and major portion of the finance for this scheme is being released by the CSU. There are 22 ASMs & 04 ASSSs recognised under this scheme. As per the latest Revised Scheme, these institutions are financially assisted to the extent of the 100% for admissible salary grant & scholarship. For other expenditures, financial assistance is given as per percentages prescribed in "Revised Adarsh Scheme-2022" for different grades of ASMs/ASSSs.

Institutions specialised in Pali/Prakrit and engaged in research/publication activities in any of these languages and fulfilling the criteria prescribed for ASSS, shall also be considered for grant of recognition under this Scheme. Such recognized institutions shall be called "Adarsh Pali Shodh Sansthan (APSS)/Adarsh Prakrit Shodh Sansthan (APrSS)".

Objectives:

The objective of the Scheme is to support and promote traditional Sanskrit learning and research. Further, in consonance with the recommendations contained in the NEP-2020 the ASM/ASSS are required to explore the possibilities of carrying out interdisciplinary studies in Sanskrit and allied Shastras/subjects. For this purpose, assistance both administrative and financial is extended under this scheme to recognized Adarsh Sanskrit Mahavidyalayas and Adarsh Sanskrit Shodh Sansthans for conducting courses at the level of Prak Shastri/Shastri& Acharya, organizing & conducting research at doctoral/post-doctoral level or both or editing & publishing manuscripts &

rare books, bringing out research based publications & Research Journals, translation of the texts from Sanskrit to other languages & vice-versa and organizing Workshops/Seminars etc. individually or in collaboration with the Central Sanskrit University or any other institutions, as applicable. The assistance envisaged here would mean general administrative and financial assistance in implementing the objectives of this scheme by virtue of the regulations of UGC as well as guidelines of Govt. of India as applicable from time to time.

1. Samarth

Samarth is an initiative of the Ministry of Education. Central Sanskrit University has successfully implemented the Samarth project in 2022 to deliver quality services to staff, students, and other stakeholders. Currently, 1567 active accounts of Central Sanskrit University are managed through Samarth. The University has increased its efficiency by leveraging digital technologies to define and govern administrative processes. Samarth offers multiple modules for managing various functional domains of university operations and administration. Central Sanskrit University is efficiently utilising the following modules:

- Leave Management,
- Legal Case Management (124 cases in system),
- Estate Management System (All Buildings - 96, All Floors - 46, All Rooms- 402, All Washrooms- 54)
- RTI Management (69 RTI)
- Core Communication System (Total of 6246 emails sent)
- User Management (Total 2263 users)

2. e-Office

e-Office is an integral part of the Digital India Programme. Central Sanskrit University has implemented this project to achieve a simplified, accountable, responsive, and transparent working in the University. e-Office is implemented in the headquarters of Central Sanskrit University and all its campuses across India. Currently, accounts of 208 employees are operational in e-Office. It is a product suite comprised of several applications for transforming the day-to-day official work-related activities. It is a digital workplace that assists the University in making quick decisions. It helps in making the work of the University paperless.

3. Media Cell

Central Sanskrit University has constituted a Media Cell for the promotion of the Sanskrit language. It is responsible for promoting Sanskrit language on all social media platforms including Twitter, YouTube and Facebook. All the programs of Central Sanskrit University are telecast on the social media handles of the University through this Cell. The Media Cell designs posters and pamphlets for the various events or programmes of the University.

4. Digital Attendance System

Central Sanskrit University has adopted a Digital Attendance System for the maintenance of accurate attendance records of its employees. Biometric Attendance machines are deployed in the headquarters office and all the campuses of the University. The attendance records of 1702 users are maintained on this system. It is developed to automate the daily attendance of staff and scholars of the University. The system uses fingerprint or face recognition feature for marking attendance. It is useful for tracking the working hours of employees from arrival to departure.

5. Rajabhasha

- To ensure the implementation of the Official Language Policy of the Union at CSU Headquarters and all their campuses.
- To Organize the Meeting of the Official Language Implementation Committee in each quarter at the CSU headquarters.
- To Dispatch the progress reports of each quarter regarding the Progressive use of Hindi from CSU headquarters and from all their campuses to Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs and Ministry of Education.

- Hindi Day being celebrated in each year at CSU headquarters and campuses and various Hindi competitions being organized during fortnight so that full enthusiasm is maintained among the Officers and Employees in performing their tasks in Hindi.
- Maintained participation of Officers and Employees of the CSU headquarters and their Campuses in Hindi Diwas and All India Official Language Conferences organized by the Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs.
- To put complete efforts to achieve the targets set in the Annual Programme issued by the Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs.
- Action on the requirements related to Town Official Language Implementation Committee as directed by the Department of Official Language, Ministry of Home Affairs.

4.1.13 CENTRE FOR SANSKRIT LEARNING

The Sanskrit language is an unparalleled treasure of Indian intellect and culture. Its scope is vast and extensive. Numerous Indians wish to study Sanskrit for the preservation and strengthening of their Indian identity. It is, therefore, essential to acquaint them- through a simple process- with the Sanskrit language and the vast body of knowledge and science embedded within it. With this noble objective, the Central Sanskrit University began *Non-formal Sanskrit Education* in 2002 to provide opportunities for Sanskrit learning to enthusiasts from various sections of society.

On the basis of applications received from reputed higher educational institutions of the country- such as the Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs, NITs, IIITs, IIMs, MNITs), Engineering and Ayurveda institutes, as well as International, Central, and State Universities and Colleges- these centres are operated by the Central Sanskrit University. Under this scheme, two courses are conducted:

1. *Certificate Course in Sanskrit Language* and
2. *Diploma in Sanskrit Language*.

Across India, these centres are managed under the guidance of the Central Committee for Non-formal Sanskrit Education. Based on the recommendation of this Central Committee, the name *Non-formal Sanskrit Education* was changed to “Centre for Sanskrit Learning” in the academic session 2024-25. Through this Centre, the following programmes were organized during the session 2024-25:

1. Meeting of the Central Committee
2. Operation of Centre for Sanskrit Learning
3. Workshop on Development of Sanskrit Learning App
4. Pre-training examination
5. Residential Sanskrit Teacher Training Camp.

Meeting of the Central Committee

On 06 May 2024, a meeting of the Central Committee of the Centre for Sanskrit Learning was held at the Saraswat Auditorium, University Headquarters, under the chairmanship of the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor. The meeting reviewed the implementation of the decisions taken in the previous session (2023-24) and selected the centres for the upcoming session while formulating an advance plan for their operation.

The following members were present at the meeting: Prof. Gopabandhu Mishra, Shri Satyanarayan Bhatt, Dr. Ranjit Kumar Tiwari, Shri K. Venkatesh Murthy, and Prof. Ratna Mohan Jha (Member Secretary).

Operation of Centre for Sanskrit Learning

In the academic session 2024-25, as per the recommendations of the Central Committee, 140 institutions operated Centres for Sanskrit Learning. These centres were established across 25 states of India, including Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Bihar, Delhi, Goa, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Manipur, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tripura, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh, Meghalaya, West Bengal, and the North-Eastern states.

These institutions included: IITs- 06, NITs- 02, IIITs- 02, MNITs- 02, Engineering Colleges- 04, Central Universities- 12, International University- 01, Deemed University- 01, Ayurvedic Medical Colleges- 10, State Universities- 13, Women's Colleges- 16, General Colleges- 55, Other Institutions- 07.

A total of 75 trained Sanskrit language teachers were appointed in these centres. In each institution, the head of the institution nominated an authorized officer to ensure smooth functioning, who regularly sent reports on the centre's activities and the teachers' monthly progress to the department.

During this session, a total of 5,776 learners (3,677 female and 2,099 male) were enrolled in the *Certificate* and *Diploma* courses in Sanskrit language. Among them, 4,574 learners were enrolled in the Certificate Course and 1,202 in the Diploma Course. Out of the total students, 5,225 were Hindu, 206 Muslim, and 45 Christian.

The Centres for Sanskrit Learning were operated not only in cities and metropolitan areas but also in remote towns, distant regions of Jammu & Kashmir, and the difficult terrains of the North-Eastern states. Students, teachers, professors, doctors, scientists, homemakers, research scholars, retired persons, business professionals, and labourers enthusiastically participated in these centres.

In both Sanskrit language courses, the study materials *Prathama Deeksha* and *Dviteeyaa Deeksha*, prepared by the Central Sanskrit University, were taught and highly appreciated by the learners. Mark sheets and certificates will be awarded to those who successfully pass the examinations.

Grand inaugural and valedictory ceremonies were organized at various centres, where distinguished guests from non-Sanskrit fields expressed their views on the importance of promoting Sanskrit. The heads of institutions have requested the University to continue operating the Centre for Sanskrit Learning in the next academic session as well.

Through these centres, 325 Sanskrit Sambhasana Varga and 45 Bala-vargas were organized. Prof. Ratna Mohan Jha of the Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi, served as the National Coordinator, overseeing the centres across India.

Workshop on Development of Sanskrit Learning App System

The Central Sanskrit University approved a project for Sanskrit language teaching through a mobile application. Under this project, a workshop was organized from 17 March 2025 to 22 March 2025 at the *Muktaswadhyaya Peetha Bhavan* of the University Headquarters. Thirteen scholars participated in this workshop, during which content related to the project was developed.

Pre-Training Assessment

With the objective of preparing skilled Sanskrit language teachers, the University organizes Residential Sanskrit Teacher Training Courses. Before the commencement of training, applicants were assessed. A total of 1,245 candidates applied for the test. Of these, 849 candidates appeared for the online written examination, and 592 candidates qualified. Subsequently, after the oral test, 305 candidates were selected for the training programme.

Residential Sanskrit Teacher Training

A 21-day Residential Sanskrit Teacher Training Camp was organized from 18 November 2024 to 10 December 2024 at the *Janaseva Vidya Kendra* in Channehalli, Bengaluru, Karnataka. A total of 160 participants attended the training (87 male and 73 female). Guidance was provided in various sessions by 11 speakers, 14 trainers, and 11 assistant trainers.

Training sessions were conducted from 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. daily. At the inaugural session, the Chief Guest was Dr. S. Ahalya, Vice-Chancellor of Karnataka Sanskrit University; the *Saraswat Guest* was Acharya Kotemane Ramachandra Bhatt; and the session was chaired by Prof. Ratna Mohan Jha, Director of *Muktaswadhyaya Peetha*.

The training programme included activities such as: Adarsha Sanskrit Sambhasana Varga, Analysis of teaching techniques based on the *Prathama Deeksha* textbook through direct instruction, Group discussions and grammar classes, Group reading practice, Development of teaching materials, Training for Balakendra, Weekly tests, Yoga sessions, Evening prayers (*Sandhyabhajan*), Recitation of *Aditya Hridaya Stotra*, Special lectures by scholars, Quiz competitions (*Rasaprashna Pratiyogita*), etc.

A Festival of Indian Language Families (*Bharatiya Bhasha Parivarotsava*) was also organized as part of the training programme. The valedictory ceremony was held under the esteemed chairmanship of Prof. Srinivasa Varakhedi, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of the University.

4.1.14 CORRESPONDENCE COURSE

Central Sanskrit University has been conducting two-year courses (Hindi and English medium) for students interested in learning Sanskrit language at home and abroad through correspondence courses since 1970.

In session 2024-2025, 12 Indian student have registered through correspondence course.

4.1.15 INSTITUTE OF OPEN AND DISTANCE EDUCATION

The Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi had launched Open and Distance Mode education for various **Traditional Sanskrit Programmes** through its Institute of Open and Distance Education in August, 2010.

In addition to these traditional degree courses, Sanskrit is taught to the general public through Non-formal Sanskrit teaching centers run in different states. Two courses are run by these centres, in which the first course is '**Sanskrit Language-Certificate-Course**' and the second is '**Sanskrit Language-Proficiency-Course**'. Apart from this, for the promotion of Sanskrit language, Sanskrit through Correspondence is conducting a **two-year elementary course in Sanskrit (Hindi and English medium)**.

Strength of learners at Institute of Open and Distance Education during academic year: 2024-2025 :

Institute of Open and Distance Education is conducting Certificate, Diploma Programs, Prakshastri (02 years) Shastri (03 years) and Acharya (02 years) programs through online mode in the academic session 2024-2025. In the academic year 2024-2025, 3204 Indian students and 96 Foreign students, a total of 3300 students have taken admission.

4.2.1 Shri Ganganath Jha Campus, Prayagraj (Uttar Pradesh)

Jha and his followers, disciples and various family members at Hindu Hostel on the occasion of second death anniversary of Dr. Ganganath Jha.

On 17 November 1943, on the occasion of the inauguration of Ganganath Jha Research Institute Mahamana Pt. Madan Mohan Malviya in his inaugural lecture had said -

"There is need for more than one center like the one you are proposing to erect here. I hope and pray that your efforts may be crowned with success and that you may be able really to build up an active center of research for ancient Sanskrit learning and other oriental languages. Knowledge is universal and it ought to be popularised. We hope that this center will be a means of creating such and other centres."

"To the students of Sanskrit, there cannot be a better ideal for inspiration than an Institute of this kind created in memory of Dr. Ganganath Jha.

With the efforts of M.M. Dr. Umesh Mishra after acquirement of land from U.P. government in Chandra Shekhar Azad Park in Compuny Garden the foundation stone of this building was laid on 13.02.1945 by the then Governor of U.P. Sir Maurice Hallett.

Sir Maurice told in very emotional words that Dr. Jha did not belong to any particular state but belonged to the whole nation. Considering his attachment to Prayagraj, it is very appropriate that a research institute should be built here in his memory from where his residual work would gain momentum.

Dr. Baburam Saxena, Dr. Ishwari Prasad, Dr. S.P. Chaturvedi and Pt. K.C. Chattopadhyay were in this committee. Till this time, the main work of the Research Institute was the publication of 'Journal'.

Its first Chair Person was Dr. Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru (1943-49). After that Dr. Bhagwandas (1949-59), Dr. S. Radhakrishnan (1959-63) Justice Mr. Kamalakanta Verma (1963-65), Dr. Gopinath Kaviraj (1965-71), respectively adorned the position of the Head of Deptt. Dr. Amarnath Jha, Dr. Adityanath Jha, Dr. Ishwari Prasad and Dr. Baburam Saxena continued to contribute to this

1. Introduction

History of Central Sanskrit University, Ganganath Jha campus starts from 17 November 1943 AD, when it was established in its earlier form as Ganganath Jha Research Institute. In the picturesque terrain of Tirtharaj Prayagraj situated on the holy banks of Ganges, Yamuna and Saraswati, Sir Ganganath Jha Research Institute was established on 17 November, 1943 AD by Mahamana Pt. 

After that this institute is thriving under the name of CS.U G.N.Jha Campus.

3. Infrastructure of Campus

Hostel - Shri Sadashiv Campus is making tireless efforts for the development of Sanskrit studies. The growth of Sanskrit knowledge depends largely on the increasing number of students. The primary needs of students are food and accommodation. If they are provided with these facilities, they will be able to focus on their studies. To meet this need, Shri Sadashiv Campus offers free hostel facilities for both men and women. The campus houses the Maharishi Valmiki Hostel (boys' hostel) and the Subhadra Women's Hostel (girls' hostel).

Sports and Gymnasium - Shri Sadashiv Campus provides various facilities, including sports and a gym, for the all-around development of its students. The campus offers a range of sports amenities that cater to the needs of students. Facilities for wrestling, badminton, kabaddi, volleyball, athletics, chess, table tennis, and other sports are available.

1. Introduction

Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi established by an Act of Parliament (formerly Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan) under the Ministry of Education, Government of India is the largest, multi-campus university in the world which has been accredited A++ by NAAC. Presently Prof. Shrinivasa Varakhedi is the Vice-Chancellor of the university. Shri Ranbir Campus, situated at Jammu, the winter capital of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, is one of the 13 (including HQ) campuses of the University. The campus building has been constructed on a stretch of land admeasuring 84 Kanals.

Objectives and Background

The history of the campus goes back to 1857 when Maharaja Sri Ranbir Singh of Jammu and Kashmir established Shri Raghunath Sanskrit Mahavidyalaya at Jammu, with a view to preserve and propagate the traditional knowledge enshrined in the Sanskrit language and literature. This Mahavidyalaya was taken over by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Government of India on April 1, 1971 and named as Shri Ranbir Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. With the declaration of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan as a multi-campus Deemed University on May 2, 2002, this institution came to be called as Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Shri Ranbir Campus. Dr. Anant Maral Shastri was the first Principal of the institution, followed by Dr. Dayanand Bhargava, Dr. J. Ganguly, Dr. Murlidhar Pandey, Dr. Jagannath Pathak, Dr. Raghav Prasad Chaudhary, Dr. Ram Kishore Shukla, Dr. Priyatam Chandra Shastri (In-charge), Dr. G. Ganganna, Prof. Vishwa Murti Shastri, Prof. Yash Pal Khajuria (In-charge), Prof. M. Chandrasekhar (In-charge), Prof. P.N. Shastri (In-charge), Prof. Ramanuja Devanathan, Prof. Bachcha Bharti (In-charge), Prof. Lokmanya Mishra (In-charge), Prof. Fateh Singh (In-charge), Sh. Sharat Chander Sharma (In-charge). Prof. Vasudev Sharma (In-charge) was the last Principal and the first Director of the Campus after the attainment of Central Sanskrit University status on 30th April 2020. After him Prof. Madan Mohan Jha took the charge of Campus Director. Presently Prof. Shreedhar Mishra is giving his valuable services as the Director of the Campus.

3. Infrastructure of the Campus

Library - The well-stocked library of the Campus enshrines about 46,000 books on various subjects.

The library also houses 72 rare manuscripts. The manuscripts are in Sharada and Devanagari scripts.

E- Library - To provide online information about the books available in the campus library to the public at large, data entry process is going on in “E-granthalaya”, the e-library of the campus.

Planetarium - To provide the theoretical and practical knowledge of Astrology to the students, a small planetarium has been established in the campus. A number of instruments and teaching aids, such as, miniature planetarium, telescopes, planet orbit model machine, phases of the

moon model machine, solar and lunar eclipse model machine, Gola Yantra and informative picture posters have been kept here for enriching the knowledge of the students.

Conference Hall - A conference hall, with conference microphones and LED projector system, having a seating capacity of 62 persons has been constructed in at the campus.

Vani Vilas Auditorium - For smooth conduct of scholarly lectures, dance, dramas, programs and other cultural activities by the students of the campus, a well-equipped auditorium with a seating capacity of 500 persons has been constructed in the campus.

Computer Lab - A computer lab also has been established by the Modern Subjects Department of the campus to provide practical computer education to the Prak-Shastri and Shastri students. The computer lab features 25 computers, air conditioners, excellent furniture, internet facility, and Wi-Fi facility.

Departmental Computers - Computers with printers and internet facility have been provided to each department for the smooth functioning of the departmental activities at the campus. Each department of the campus has its own Smart Class rooms with Wi-Fi and internet facility.

Departmental Libraries - In order to make books conveniently available to the teachers and students, and to inculcate in them an interest in reading, Departmental libraries have been established in all the departments of the campus. Each department houses books amounting to Rs. 50,000/- catering to the interest of the students and teachers.

Language Lab - Language Lab was established in the Department of Education in academic year 2016-17. For this purpose, 11 computers has been provided in the lab for their language skill development.

Psychology Lab - Department of Education houses Psychology Lab with new equipments, which include electronic equipments.

Teaching and Non-teaching Staff - The Campus is staffed with 48 faculty members, comprising of Professors, Associate Professors, and Assistant Professors, Contract Teachers, and Guest Teachers. Moreover, the campus has 39 ministerial staff, 10 guards besides outsourcing staff which is increased or decreased as the situation arrises.

Hostels - For the students coming from the far-flung areas of the state and other parts of the country, separate hostel facility for both boys and girls has been provided. The hostels are well-equipped with modern facilities. They have 84 rooms, capable of accommodating 168 students. The hostels also have geysers and arrangements for filtered drinking water. Both the hostels have separate mess.

Staff Quarters - There are staff quarters inside the campus, to cater to the residential needs of the Director, hostel superintendent, wardens and teaching staff of the campus.

Gymnasium - Yoga and physical exercise facility is also provided to the students to ensure their physical and mental health well-being. For this purpose, a gymnasium equipped with modern exercising machines and a ten-seat work station, has been established. An open gym has also been installed in the campus with seven exercise stations.

Playground - The campus has a large playground where a variety of athletic and sports activities are organized from time to time.

4. Major Activities

Traditional Sanskrit Studies

Under the traditional Sanskrit education, there is a system of credit system based Prakshastri (Semester) (Intermediate), Shastri (Semester) (B.A.) and Acharya (Semester) (M.A.) academic studies in Shri Ranbir Campus. These classes include traditional classical subjects like, Vyakaran, Sahitya, Darshan along with the principles and results of astrology and Vedas and Sanskrit and modern subjects like Hindi, Dogri, English, History, Political Science, Computer and Environmental Education, Yoga etc. are also studied.

Professional Education -Professional Course Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) runs under the Department of Education.

Certificate Courses -Campus has started newly designed Diploma and Certificate courses in Ved-Karamkand-Pourahitya, Jyotish Shastra (Vastu Shastra) and a One-year Diploma Course in Yoga.

Research Activities -In order to conduct multi-dimensional research activities in relevant fields of Sanskrit learning, there are arrangements for Ph.D. (Vidyavaridhi) guidance. At present, 12 students are registered as research scholars in the campus.

Shaivism of Kashmir -Kashmir Shaiva Darshan is a priceless legacy of Jammu and Kashmir. For the conservation and preservation of this priceless legacy, the Campus is exclusively running a Kashmir Shaiva Darshan Project on its premises. Through the tireless efforts of Late Dr. Baljinath Pandit and the research assistants associated with the project, two volumes of Kashmir Shaiva Darshan have been published, which are available for sale. The copies of the volumes are being sent all over India and the world.





5. Publications

The campus has published 23 books relating to the various branches of knowledge. There is a great demand in the country for the books relating to Kashmir Shaiva Darshan. Publication of Annual Research Magazine "Shri Vaishnavi" (UGC care Listed in 2022) featuring research-oriented articles, poems etc. in Sanskrit, English, Hindi, Dogri is being carried on regularly since the inception of the institution. The magazine has been granted ISSN- 755 2277 906X by the National Institute of Science and Communication and Information Resources, New Delhi. Besides this, Education Department also has been publishing a Shiksha-Shastra journal titled "Shiksha-mritam" (UGC care Listed) since the academic year 2011-12.

Studies and Research Activities

Shri Ranbir Campus provides an education based on beautiful combination of traditional and modern systems of education. As per the directions of the Headquarters, New Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) has been implemented in the Campus since the academic year 2022-23. Class-wise teaching arrangements are as follow:-

i) Traditional Sanskrit Studies

The Campus has begun teaching as per Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). The CBCS provides choice for students to select from the various courses proposed under NEP 2020. Under the traditional Sanskrit Studies, the Campus has arrangements for teaching Prak-Shastri (Intermediate 10+2 in Semester system), Shastri (B.A.) and Acharya (M.A.). Traditional Sanskrit subjects include Sanskrit Grammar (Vyakarana), Sanskrit Literature (Sahitya), Philosophy (Darshana), Astrology (Siddhanta and Phalit Jyotisha), and Vedic Literature (Veda). Along with these subjects, English, Hindi, Dogri, History, Political Science, Computer Science, Environmental Science, Physical Education and Yoga are also taught as Modern subjects.

ii) Professional Education

Professional Course Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.) runs under the Department of Education.

iii) Diploma and Certificate Courses

Campus has started newly designed Diploma and Certificate courses in Ved-Karamkand-Pourahitya and Jyotish Shastra (Vastu Shastra) respectively and, has been in the process of initiating a One-year Diploma Course in Yoga.

iv) Research Activities

In order to conduct multi-dimensional research activities in relevant fields of Sanskrit learning, there are arrangements for Ph.D. (Vidyavaridhi) guidance. At present, 12 students are registered as research scholars in the campus.

Distance Education Centre (*Muktaswadhyayapeetham*)

For the purpose of promotion and propagation of Sanskrit at the world level, a distance education institution called *Muktaswadhyayapeetham* has been established which is duly recognized by the Distance Education Council of India. All the campuses of the Sansthan have a centre of the *Muktaswadhyayapeetham*, called *Muktaswadhyayakendram*.

The *Muktaswadhyayakendram* at Shri Ranbir Campus started in 2010-11. The centre provides Intermediate (Prak-Shastri), B.A. (Shastri) and M.A. (Acharya) courses as per annual exam system. A special feature of the *Muktaswadhyayapeetham* is that there is an arrangement for Bridge courses for non-Sanskrit students. Under these courses, the students are provided audio-visual material with other course material such as textbooks etc. so that non-Sanskrit students also can learn Sanskrit easily in a short time.

In addition to Sanskrit *Sahitya*, *Vyakarna* and *Jyotisha* subjects, the centre is also conducting a course in *Sanskrit Journalism*. There are plans for introducing other classical subjects. Besides these, certificate courses in Dramatics (*Natyashastra*), Pali, Prakrit etc, would be introduced soon. For these initiatives, the Sansthan Headquarters, the *Muktaswadhayayapeetham* and all the lovers of Sanskrit deserve to be congratulated. A number of members of local Intelligentia such as, engineers, doctors, lawyers, and teachers have joined the courses offered by the *Kendram*.

Kashmir Shaiva Darshan Project

Kashmir Shaiva Darshan is a priceless legacy of Jammu and Kashmir. For the conservation and preservation of this priceless legacy, the Campus is exclusively running a Kashmir Shaiva Darshan Project on its premises. Through the tireless efforts of Late Dr. Baljinath Pandit and the research assistants associated with the project, two volumes of Kashmir Shaiva Darshan have been published, which are available for sale. The copies of the volumes are being sent all over India and the world.

1. Introduction

Kerala, the God's own Country, sanctified by the birth of AdiSankara, is exalted to the pinnacle as a place, of living without discrimination of caste, colour, gender and creed as influenced by Jagad Guru Shri Shankaracharya's philosophy of Advaita Vedanta. Samskritapranayabhanam P.T. Kuriakkose Master started Guruvayoor Sahitya Deepika Sanskrit Vidyapeetha at Pavaratty in 1909 and in 1934 UG and PG Courses were started under Madras University, which was later in 1972 taken by Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, New Delhi and rechristened it as Sahitya Deepika Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. In 1979 it was renamed as GuruvayoorKendriya Sanskrit Vidhyapeetha and was shifted to present location in 1983. The New Administrative and Academic block located at Puranattukara was inaugurated by Dr. Murali Manohar Joshi, the then Hon'ble HRD Minister, on 16th August 1998. Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan was raised to the status of a multi campus Deemed University and this institution was renamed as Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, Guruvayoor Campus on 7th May 2002. It has been raised to the status as the CENTRAL SANSKRIT UNIVERSITY by the Parliamentary Act in the year 2020.

4.2.8 Vedvyas Campus, Balahar, Himachal Pradesh

1. Introduction

The Central Sanskrit University is an institution run by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, offering multi-level education in Sanskrit. One of its campuses is located in Balahar village, Kangra district, Himachal Pradesh, known as the Ved Vayas Campus. The campus was established on September 16, 1997, under the name Central Sanskrit Vidyapeeth in India's first Heritage village, Garli. In 2002, it was renamed as the Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed University) in Garli. Since January 28, 2012, this campus has been operating in its newly constructed building in Balahar village with an expenditure of ₹13.26 crores. 1. Introduction

This institution was formerly located in K.J. Somaiya, Mumbai Metropolitan Region. It was established by the name of K. J. Somaiya Campus from 16th May 2002. The event provided a comprehensive platform for educators, researchers, and policymakers to deliberate on the future of higher education under NEP-2020. With active participation and thought-provoking discussions, the session concluded on a high note, reinforcing the commitment to education reform and innovation.

IKS Lecture Series

In compliance with the Headquarters Letter No. 17-2/Acd/CSU/Academic/2024/1957 dated 05.03.2025, the Central Sanskrit University, Ekalavya Campus successfully organized a series of special lectures related to the *Indian Knowledge System (IKS)* in various departments during March 2025. Eminent scholars were invited as speakers, and teachers and students actively participated. The details are as follows:

- 1. Department of Sahitya (Literature):** On 19 March 2025, an online lecture on "*Abhavapakshakhandanapurassaram Dhvanisthapanam*" was delivered by Prof. Suryamani Rath, Former Head, Department of Sahitya, Shri Sadashiva Campus. He discussed the subtleties of Sanskrit poetics and emotional expression through the theory of *Dhvani*. Teachers and students, along with the Director, participated enthusiastically, followed by an in-depth question-answer session.
- 2. Department of Vyakarana (Grammar):** On 20 March 2025, a lecture on "*Karaka Vimarshah*" was organized in the Guru Dronacharya Auditorium. Prof. Kishore Chandra Padhi, Former Vice-Chancellor, Shri Jagannath Sanskrit University, delivered a scholarly talk highlighting the structure of Pāṇini's *Karaka System* and its relevance in modern linguistics.
- 3. Department of Dharmashastra:** On 20 March 2025, a lecture on "*Kalatattva Vimarshah*" was held in the Guru Dronacharya Auditorium. 7. **Department of Buddhist Studies and Pali:** On 24 March 2025, an online lecture on "*From Shravasti to Saketa: Lord Buddha in the Context of Southeast Asia*" was delivered by Dr. Rakesh Singh, Director, International Buddhist Research Institute, Lucknow. He discussed *Buddhacharita*, pilgrimage traditions, and the spread of Buddhist culture in Southeast Asia.
8. **Department of Education:** On 27 March 2025, an online lecture on "*Employment Opportunities in IKS for Sanskrit Students*" was delivered by Dr. Dipesh Vinod Katira, Assistant Professor, IIT Kharagpur. He provided detailed information on career opportunities for Sanskrit students in IKS, Artificial Intelligence, language technology, research, and government and private sectors.

Through all these lectures, students gained deeper understanding of the Indian Knowledge System and were inspired to integrate IKS concepts into their own studies.

4.2.12 Shri Raghunath Kirti Campus, Devaprayag, Uttarakhand

1. Introduction

Shri Raghunath Kirti Campus, Central Sanskrit University (formerly *rāṣṭrīya saṃskṛta saṃsthāna*, Deemed University) was established on 16th June, 2016 at *devaprayāga*, Pauri Garhwal, Uttarakhand by a Parliamentary Act under the Ministry of Education, Government of India. The campus is named after Shri Raghunath Ji of Devprayag, whose ancient Raghunath Temple, in the style of the mountainous *katyūrī* dynasty, was built near the holy confluence of two important mythological rivers, the Bhagirathi and the Alaknanda, from where the river Ganga is believed to originate. And from here the confluence of these two streams took place of the knowledge stream of Sanskrit which has given the form of *Triveni* to this confluence.

Uttarakhand is culturally and popularly known as *devabhūmī* because it is not only adorned with the famous *jyotirmaṭha* called Shri Badrinath but also with Shri Kedarnath, one of the twelve *Jyotirlingas*. Ganga and Yamuna, the two Vedic, mythological rivers originate from the Himalayas of Uttarakhand. According to the *kedārakhaṇḍa* of *skandapurāṇa*, it got its name *devaprayāga* due to the rigorous penance performed at this holy place by sage Shri Devsharma. It is one of the *pañca prayāga* where the rivers Alaknanda and Bhagirathi join to form the river Ganga. *devaprayāga* city is surrounded by three mountain ranges, *grddhāmcala*, *daśarathāmcala* and *nṛsimhāmcala*. Among these, Nrisinghanchal was famous as a center of education in the state of Uttarakhand, due to which it got the name *vidyākṣetram*. Uttarakhand is the only state in India where Sanskrit is the official second language.

The campus covers an area of 9.228 hectares (23 acres). CPWD, Srinagar Branch has completed 90% construction work of various academic, administrative, and residential buildings (boys and girls' hostels, guest houses, and staff quarters) of the campus. About 500 students have been admitted to various classes at Pre-Shastri, Shastri, Acharya and Ph.D. level and they are being taught by proficient teachers of various subjects like Grammar, Literature, Astrology, Yoga, Philosophy, *karmakāṇḍapaurohityam*, etc. Modern subjects like Hindi, English, History, Computer Science and Physical Education are also being taught. The campus also organizes national / international seminars, workshops, and detailed lectures in the academic session. As an initiative, the campus has started an informal course to improve the fluency of Sanskrit spoken by the students. The campus library has more than 4000 books and manuscripts in both physical and digital form. To enrich and engage the knowledge of the students, it is proposed to publish a six-monthly international research journal (*devabhūmī Saurabham*) along with various research papers and journals in department wise journals.

7. Seminars, Workshops, and Lecture Series Organized by the Campus

A one-day national seminar on various concepts and theories of grammar was organized at Central Sanskrit University's Shri Raghunath Kirti Campus. He emphasized making these Sanskrit words accessible to learners in Hindi, thus familiarizing more people. Dr. Ganeshwar Jha gave lectures on various grammar rules during the seminar. The convenor, Dr. Suryamani Bhandari, presented the seminar's proposal and highlighted its usefulness.

North Regional Youth Festival:

The grand event of sports, cultural, and educational competitions under the auspices of Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi, was inaugurated at Shri Raghunath Kirti Campus. Chief guest, mountaineer Santosh Yadav, stated that this sports mega-festival, with participation from students of northern states, reflects the message of unity in cultural diversity. Guest of honor, Executive Director of THDC, Lakshmi Prasad Joshi, spoke on how Sanatan culture provides mental satisfaction and also guides the path to liberation, encouraging character building and personality development. Campus director Prof. P.V.B. Subrahmanyam said it was a proud moment for the then-newly-established campus to host these games.

Winter Workshop:

A week-long intensive workshop on various dimensions of astrology named "Suryasiddhanta" was conducted to deeply analyze time and related concepts. Kondi, welcoming the chief guest, Prof. Ravi Prakash Tekchandani, Director of National Sindhi Language Development Council, who spoke about the history of Sindhi and the importance of yoga in Indian civilization. The campus director stressed the connection between Sanskrit, culture, and yoga. Prof. Kondi explained the importance and promotion of yoga in society and day-to-day life. 

Collaborating Institution - Yayasan Dvipantara Samskrtam (YDS), Bali. The visit was organized in collaboration with YDS, a reputed institution actively engaged in promoting Sanskrit learning and traditional knowledge in Indonesia.

Participation

The delegation comprised CSU team members and various stakeholders associated with Sanskrit education and promotion in Indonesia. The interactions included meetings with faculty members, Sanskrit practitioners, cultural scholars, and community representatives.

Expenditure

The total expenditure for the academic visit was approximately ₹ 3,00,000/- covering travel, accommodation, logistics, and related administrative expenses.

Major Accomplishments

- Identification of Potential Areas of Collaboration: The CSU team assessed the educational landscape and identified meaningful areas where bilateral cooperation could significantly enhance Sanskrit learning and research in Indonesia.
- Initiation of a MoU with YDS: A mutual understanding was reached to formalize collaboration between Central Sanskrit University and Yayasan Dvipantara Samskrtam. The proposed MoU is expected to facilitate joint academic programmes, faculty exchange, training workshops, Sanskrit conversation camps, and research initiatives.
- Strengthening Cultural and Academic Relations: The visit helped deepen academic and cultural connections, paving the way for long-term engagement in promoting Sanskrit knowledge traditions at the international level.

Conclusion

The Academic Visit to Bali was highly productive and aligned with CSU's vision of expanding global partnerships for Sanskrit promotion. The identification of collaborative prospects and the initiation of a MoU with YDS mark significant steps toward fostering international cooperation in the field of Sanskrit studies.

5. Event: Training Programme for Nepalese Gurukul Students

Dare: 10th to 16th March, 2025

Venue: CSU Shri Raghunath Kirti Campus, Devprayag

Collaboration:

The programme was organized in collaboration with *Neeti Anusandhan Pratishthan Nepal, Kathmandu*, with the objective of strengthening academic and cultural ties between Nepal and India in the field of traditional Gurukul education.

Participation:

A total of 28 Gurukul students and 2 accompanying teachers from Nepal participated in the week-long training programme.

Expenditure:

The total expenditure incurred for the programme was approximately ₹5,00,000.

Accomplishment:

The training programme provided structured exposure to traditional learning systems, Sanskrit language competency, and cultural heritage studies. The students benefitted through interactive sessions, practical learning modules, and direct engagement with faculty members of the campus.

Overall, the initiative contributed to promoting Sanskrit learning and enhancing academic cooperation with Nepalese institutions.

6. Event: International Conference

Date: 21st to 22nd March 2024

Venue: Haridwar.

An International Conference was organized from 21st to 22nd March 2024 at Haridwar, focusing on strengthening academic ties between India and Nepal, and promoting Sanskrit studies across both nations.

Collaboration

The event was jointly organized in collaboration with:

- Neeti Anusandhan Pratishtan Nepal, Kathmandu
- University of Patanjali, Haridwar

This collaborative initiative aimed to encourage cross-border academic exchange and enhance mutual understanding of Sanskrit knowledge traditions.

Participation

A total of 26 Nepalese Sanskrit Scholars participated in the Bharat–Nepal Sanskrit Sammelan 2025. Their participation created a vibrant academic environment, facilitating meaningful dialogue among scholars, researchers, and traditional practitioners of Sanskrit from both countries.

Expenditure

The programme was conducted with an approximate expenditure of ₹13,00,000.

Accomplishment

The conference successfully achieved the following outcomes:

- Promotion of Nepalese Traditional and Modern Sanskrit Scholarship, providing a platform for distinguished Nepalese scholars to present their research and intellectual contributions.
- Strengthened Academic Interaction between Bharatiya Sanskrit Scholars and Nepalese Sanskrit Scholars, fostering long-term collaboration in the fields of Sanskrit education, research, and cultural studies.
- Encouragement of Cross-Cultural Dialogue, reinforcing the shared intellectual heritage of Bharat and Nepal rooted in Sanskrit knowledge systems.

- Conduct Certificate Course in Gym Instructor, Fitness Trainer, Yoga Trainer and Health & Fitness etc.



Centre for Pali Study and Research Central Sanskrit University, Lucknow Campus, Lucknow

With the objective of teaching, research, propagation and preservation of the Pali language, the 'Centre for Pali Studies' was established in 2009 following the approval of the Ministry of Education, Government of India, vide letter No. 11-13/2007-Skt.-II dated 27-02- 2008. Special budgetary provision was made for it under the 11th Five-Year Plan. The Centre was formally inaugurated on 22 January 2010 under the chief patronage of His Excellency Shri B.L. Joshi, the then Governor of Uttar Pradesh. On this occasion, Dr. Anita Bhatnagar Jain, the then Joint Secretary (Languages), Government of India; Prof. Radhavallabh Tripathi, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of the then Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (now Central Sanskrit University), New Delhi; Campus Director Prof. Sarvanarayan Jha; Head of the Department of Buddhist Philosophy Prof. Vijay Kumar Jain and many other distinguished persons were present.

Immediately after its establishment, appointments of JRF/SRF were made at the Centre. In the session 2024-25, one Pali Development Officer (contractual) and one Research Associate are working at the Centre. So far, scholars of the Centre have critically edited 20 Tripitaka texts and published their Sanskrit chāyā translation and Hindi translation.

Since 2014, a half-yearly research journal titled Pali-Prākṛta-Anusūlanam has been published. In 2016-17, this journal was included in the UGC list (now UGC-CARE). In the session 2024-25, its 8th issue has been published from Delhi. It may be noted that the first seven issues of the journal were published from the Lucknow Campus, but from the 8th issue onwards, it has been decided to publish subsequent issues from the Delhi Headquarters. Nevertheless, the work of article collection, editing, etc., continues to be carried out by the professors of the Buddhist Philosophy Department of Lucknow Campus and by the scholars of the Centre for Pali Study and Research (Lucknow Campus) and the Centre for Prakrit Study and Research (Jaipur Campus).

As per Notification No. 08-05/CSU/Acd./School & Dept./2022/39 dated 07 April 2025 issued by the Delhi Headquarters, the Centre has now been renamed "Centre for Pali Study and Research". It has also been decided to place it under the Faculty of Language, Literature and Culture instead of the Faculty of Philosophy. Through the said notification, it has been decided that the M.A. Pali programme will now be conducted through this Centre. Accordingly, in the session 2024-25, the programme is being run through the Centre. In this session, 31 students have been admitted in the first year. The teaching responsibility is being discharged by the professors of the Buddhist Philosophy Department along with the Development Officer and Research Associate working at the Centre. In the session 2024-25, Prof. Gurucharan Singh Negi, Chairman, Department of Buddhist Philosophy (Central), is also holding the charge of Chairman of the Centre for Pali Study and Research. Since the session 2020-21, he has also been working as Officer-in-Charge of the Centre as per the instructions of the Campus Director. All financial matters of the Centre remain under the Campus Director.

On 28 June 2025, a high-level three-member committee constituted by the Headquarters visited the Campus to review the Centre. The members of the committee were:

1. Prof. Vijay Kumar Jain (Director, Bhogilal Leherchand Institute of Indology, Delhi)
2. Prof. Jitendra Bhai Shah (Former Director, L.D. Institute of Indology, Ahmedabad)
3. Prof. Kuldeep Sharma (Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi)

Works completed by the scholars of the Centre in the session 2024-25: With a view to universal teaching of Pali language, the Headquarters had directed the preparation of a series of textbooks titled Pali Paṭhamā Dikkhā on the lines of Samskr̥ta Prathamā Dīkṣā. In compliance thereof, the composition and typing of five books of Pali Paṭhamā Dikkhā have been completed. The titles of the books are as follows:

It is planned to publish the above five books in an attractive and systematic format using appealing graphics in accordance with Buddhist tradition. In addition to the above books, the scholars have completed at their level the Sanskrit chāyā/Hindi translation of the following six texts: Apadānapāli Vol. 3, Culavamsapāli, Culaniddesapali, Dhammasanganipāli Vol. 2, Kathā-vatthupāli, Vibhangapāli Vol. 1. Only the revision by subject experts remains pending.

Tribal Research Centre, Eklavya Campus

Tribal Research Centre

Central Sanskrit University, Ekalavya Campus feels privileged having a Tribal Research Centre of its own which provides a platform for intensive & extensive research on tribal language & culture. This Centre was set up in the campus in compliance with the letter received from the Competent Authority of CSU, New Delhi (Letter no. 8-4/CSU/Acd/AC/Oct./2024/1527, Dated: 04-12-2024. Henceforth, this centre is committed to initiate various kinds of steps for effective execution and fulfilment of the objectives of this centre. The below mentioned initiative has been initiated at the initial level –

A Simple Standard Sanskrit Training Program for tribal students

A Simple Standard Sanskrit Training Program was organized for Schedule Tribe students from March 17, 2025, to March 23, 2025 by Tribal Research Centre of Central Sanskrit University, Ekalavya Campus. The program aimed to promote the Sanskrit language and literature among the students. In this training programme, 89 students registered through a Google Form registration link. Out of them, 58 students were present in all sessions of the training programme.

All India Secretary of Sanskrit Bharati, Vidyavachaspati Dr. Nand Kumar Ji, was present as the Chief Guest in the inaugural session on 17th March 2025. Tripura's eminent social worker, Smt. Dipali Debbarma, was present as the Guest of Honour. The Director of Eklavya Campus, Prof. Prabhat Kumar Mohapatra, chaired the inaugural session.

In this entire training workshop, Mr. Nayan Jyoti Sharma, Mr. Bikram Biswas, Ms. Shipra Ghosh, and Dr. Tapan Shil were present as trainers for Sanskrit language teaching. 

Schedule 23 - Significant Accounting Policies

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and generally on the accrual method of accounting.

2. REVENUE RECOGNITION

- 2.1. Fees from students (except Tuition Fees), Sale of Admission form, Royalty and Interest on Saving Bank account are accounted on cash basis.
- 2.2. Income from Investments are accounted on accrual basis.

3. FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

- 3.1. Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition including inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition, installation and commissioning.
- 3.2. Gifted/Donated assets are valued at the declared value where available; if not available, the value is estimated based on the present market value adjusted with reference to the physical condition of the asset. They are set up by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the Institution. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets.
- 3.3. Books received as gifts, are valued at selling prices printed on the books. Where they are not printed, the value is based on assessment.
- 3.4. Fixed assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on Straight line method, at the following rates:

3.5 Depreciation is provided for the whole year on additions during the year.

3.6 Where an asset is fully depreciated, it will be carried at a residual value of Re.1 in the Balance Sheet and will not be further depreciated. Thereafter, depreciation is calculated on the additions of each year separately at the rate of depreciation applicable for that asset head.

3.7 Assets created out of Earmarked Funds and funds of Sponsored Projects, where the ownership of such assets vests in the University, are setup by credit to Capital Fund and merged with the Fixed Assets of the University. Depreciation is charged at the rates applicable to the respective assets. Assets created out of Sponsored Project funds, where the ownership is retained by the sponsors but held and used by the University are separately disclosed in the Notes on Accounts.

3.8 Leasehold Land is amortized over period of lease.

4. Intangible Assets: Patents and copy rights, E Journals and Computer Software are grouped under Intangible Assets.

5. STOCKS

Expenditure on purchase of office and computer stationary stock is accounted as revenue expenditure. However, being a pioneer/nodal institution for the propagation and development of Sanskrit stock of University publication/books are treated as fixed assets. (refer Schedule-4)

6. RETIREMENT BENEFITS

- 6.1 Retirement benefits are treated as per GOI Rules. Its includes Pension, Gratuity, Leave encashment and Provident Fund.
- 6.2 The provision for gratuity, leave encashment and pension have been computed by actuarial valuer.
- 6.3 A fixed medical alloance of Rs.1000/- p.m. is being paid by Govt. of India OM dated 19.07.2017.
- 6.4 For Provident Fund of employees of University a separate set of accounts - Receipt & Payment, Income & Expenditure and Balance Sheet are prepared and is attached with these accounts.
- 6.5 For pension also an earmarked fund has been created in which Govt. Grant and expenditure is accounted in Schedule-2.
- 6.6 318 employees are covered under New Pension Scheme.

7. INVESTMENTS

Investment is in the form of Fixed Deposit in the bank. There is no diminution in its value.

8. Earmarked / Endowment Funds

8.1 University is having one earmarked fund for Pension and Endowment funds in the name of Jindal Trust, Dubey Award, Somaiya Trust, Shukla Trust and RK Sharma, R Devanathan, Dr. Hindkesari, Smt. Savitri & Sh. Harihar Jha, Smt. & Sh. Madala Sriramalingeswara Rao S. All these dedicated funds have been depicted in Schedule-2

8.2 Expenditure on the special funds is deducted from these funds only and not taken to the Income & Expenditure account.

9. Government/ UGC Grants

9.1 University is functioning on the basis of grant received from UGC which is being accounted on realization basis. However, where a sanction for release of grant pertaining to the financial year is received before 31st March and the grant is actually received in the next financial year, the grant is accounted on accrual basis and an equal amount is shown as recoverable from the Grantor.

9.2 Grant utilized for fixed assets has been shown as Capital expenditure and remaining as revenue. (refer Schedule-10)

9.3 Unutilized grants as carried forward as unspent (refer Schedule-10) and exhibited as a liability in the Balance Sheet. (refer Schedule-3)

10. INVESTMENT OF EARMARKED I FUNDS AND INTEREST INCOME ACCURED ON SUCH INVESTMENT:

10.1 These earmarked funds are invested in fixed deposit in Banks.

10.2 Interest received, interest accrued and due and interest accrued but not due on such investments are added to the respective funds and not treated as income of the University. (refer Schedule-2)

11. SPONSORED PROJECTS

University is having one project of UGC - SRF/JRF (Senior/Junior Research Fellow) funded by UGC.

12. INCOME TAX

12.1 The University is a Central Sanskrit University and fully finance through Govt. grant. The income of the University is exempt from Income Tax under Section 10(23c) of the Income Tax Act. No provision for tax is therefore made in the accounts. No TDS is deducted by the bank on investment in Terms Deposits.

13. PENSION FUND

During the year, the University has created a Pension Fund in State Bank of India for disbursement of pension to its pensioners through Centralized Pension Processing Centre (CPPC).

Opinion of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of Central Sanskrit University for the year ended 31 March 2025

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Central Sanskrit University, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 March 2025 and the Income & Expenditure Account/Receipts & Payment Account for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act read with section 32 (1) Central Sanskrit University Act, 2020. These financial statements include the accounts of units/branches of the AB. These financial statements include the accounts of 12 University campuses. Out of these, accounts of one university campus were audited during the year and comment considered for inclusion in the audit report.

This Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards, and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions regarding compliance with the Law, Rules and Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency cum performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through inspection reports/CAG's audit reports separately.

In our opinion the accompanying financial statements of Central Sanskrit University, read together with the accounting policies and Notes thereon and matters mentioned in the Separate Audit Report, which follows, give a true and fair view of the financial position of the autonomous body as at March 31, 2025, and (of) its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with uniform format of accounts.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the CAG's auditing regulations/standards/manuals/guidelines/guidance-notes/orders/circulars etc. Our responsibilities are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the autonomous body in accordance with ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. Separate Audit Report on the Accounts of Central Sanskrit University for the year 2024-25

A. Balance Sheet

A.1 Liabilities

A.1.1 Current Liabilities & Provisions (Schedule 3) : ₹ 677.22 crore

The above included Corpus Fund liability amounting to ₹ 50,27,70,808 which was created out of internal resources. This should have been shown under Corpus Fund/Capital Fund. This resulted in overstatement of Current Liabilities and understatement of Corpus/Capital Fund.

A.2 Assets

A.2.1 Fixed Assets (Schedule 4) : ₹ 258.48 crore

Sringeri Campus:- The above includes an amount of ₹ 5,40,89,259 involving a total of twelve (12) capital works wherein the respective works have already been completed and possession of the same has been taken by the University and are being put to use. However, the same has still been kept in capital work in progress without being taken to the Fixed Asset. The above omission has resulted in overstatement of capital work-in-progress to the tune of ₹ 5,40,89,259 and understatement of the Fixed Asset by ₹ 5,30,07,474 and depreciation by ₹ 10,81,785.

B. Income & Expenditure:

B.1. Expenditure

B.1.1. Repairs & Maintenance Expenses (Schedule 19) – ₹ 5.70 crore

Sringeri Campus:- The above Schedule under Repairs & maintenance related to 'Building CPWD' includes a total amount of ₹ 3,62,49,120 (payments of ₹ 1,78,54,044 dated 29.10.2024 and ₹ 1,83,95,076 dated 19.03.2025 made to Exec. Engineer CPWD) in respect of 3 nos. Civil works which are capital in nature and the same have been completed during FY 2024-25 as seen from the relevant documents. However, as per the Uniform Format of accounts prescribed by MoE the above expenses were required to be shown under Schedule 4-Addition to Fixed Assets for the FY 2024-25.

Thus, the above omission has resulted in overstatement of Schedule 19-Repairs & Maintenance Expenses by ₹ 3.62 crore and understatement of Schedule 4-Fixed Assets by ₹ 3.55 crore and depreciation by ₹ 7.24 lakh consequently overstatement of 'excess of expenditure over income' and understatement of Capital Fund by the same amount.

C. General

C.1 During scrutiny, a few differences between the Consolidated Accounts balances and the sum of balances of the accounts of Head Office and all campuses were noticed as detailed below:-

The CSU was asked to clarify these differences with the supporting documents for reconciliation but no clarification with supporting documents was furnished to audit. As a result, audit could not verify the following consolidated figure of Schedules in the consolidated accounts.

CSU replied that the reasons have been identified and rectification will be done in the accounts for the year 2025-26. The reconciliation and rectification carried out by CSU will be verified during next audit.

C.2 An amount of Rs. 21.14 lakh has been depicted as assets and liabilities under NPS Balance Sheet as on 31.03.2025. Since this money belongs to the subscriber, necessary disclosure of the same should have been made in the Notes to Accounts of CSU New Delhi accounts. Further proper reconciliation of the Assets and Liabilities depicted in the NPS Balance Sheet should be done by CSU and necessary action taken as per NPS Rules and directions of Government/PFRDA.

C.3 The amount received in the Earmarked Fund account during the year ₹ 41,71,695 was mistakenly added to both Other Income (Schedule-13) and Earmarked Fund (Schedule-2). resulting in overstatement of Other Income by ₹ 41,71,695. Reasons of the above discrepancy and also the accounting treatment made on the debit side was not furnished to audit.

C.4 An amount of ₹ 17,49,745 transferred from Campus during the year was incorrectly added twice Other Income (Schedule 13) and Corpus/Capital fund (Schedule 1). This has resulted in overstatement of Other Income by ₹ 17,49,745. Reasons of the above discrepancy and also the accounting treatment made on the debit side was not furnished to audit.

D. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Vice Chancellor, CSU through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

E. Annexure to audit report

1. Adequacy of Internal Control System

- The internal control system of CSU Hqrs. needs to be strengthened as 21 audit paras of CSU Hqrs were outstanding as on 31.3.2025.

2. Adequacy of Internal audit System

- The University have, one post of Accounts Officer (Internal Audit). The Post was filled up w.e.f. 08.05.2023. There is no separate Internal Audit Wing during the FY 2023-24 of the University. However, the Competent Authority has approved the separate Internal Audit Cell of the University during the FY 2024-25.
- During the Financial Year 2024-25 the Internal Audit of CSU (Hqrs.) has been conducted for the period 2019-24.
- Out of the 08 planned Campuses internal audit of 05 Campuses were done during the year 2024-25.
- The Executive Council of the University has approved the Internal Audit Manual of the University during the FY 2024-25 and notified on dated 27.08.2024.

3. System of physical verification of assets

- The physical verification of Fixed Assets of CSU Hqrs. has been conducted upto 31.3.2024.
- Physical verification of Library books of CSU Hqrs has been done upto 2024-25.

4. System of physical verification of inventory

- The physical verification of inventories of CSU Hqrs such as stationery and consumables has been done upto 31.3.2024.

5. Regularity in payment of dues

As per accounts, no payment over six months in respect of statutory dues (NPS, GI Premium, GIS liability, TDS) was outstanding as on 31.03.2025.

F. Grant in Aid

The Central Sanskrit University received Grants-in-aid of ₹ 357.19 crore (Non-NER: ₹ 341.00 crore and NER: ₹ 16.19 crore) during the year 2024-25 and had an opening balance of ₹ 67,626 (Non-NER: ₹ 67,626). Out of the total fund of ₹ 357.20 crore (Non-NER: ₹ 341.01 and NER: ₹ 16.19 crore). It utilized ₹ 357.20 crore (Non-NER: ₹ 341.01 crore and NER: ₹ 16.19 crore) leaving an unspent balance of NIL.
