Introduction



- ❑ The Sanskrit Commission appointed by the Government of India in 1956 have recommended that help and patronage should be extended to important active private academies and bodies which are working for Sanskrit.
- ❑ In pursuance of the said instructions, the Government of India has introduced various Central Schemes for the promotion of Sanskrit.
- ❑ These schemes were previously undertaken by the Ministry of H.R.D., Government of India.
- ❑ Later, Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India decided to transfer these schemes along with Budget provisions to Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan from time to time.
- ❑ These Schemes are being executed and implemented by duly constituted Grants in Aid Committee.
- ❑ Accordingly, the CSU working as the nodal agency of Govt. of India for overall promotion and development of Sanskrit language & education

Vision



Sanskrit, containing vast treasures of mathematics, philosophy, grammar, music, politics, medicine, architecture, metallurgy, drama, poetry, storytelling, and more (known as 'Sanskrit Knowledge Systems').

To bring qualitative change in Sanskrit Education through research.

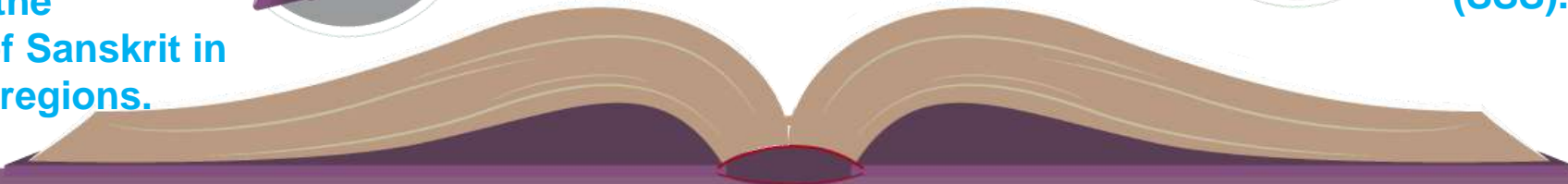
To use new methods of imparting Sanskrit Education with the help of modern tools and technologies.

- Preparing Bilingual Dictionaries with Sanskrit as one of the Languages.
- Preparation and publication of Sanskrit manuscripts.
- Preparation, publication & maintaining the standard and improvements of contents and quality of Sanskrit journals and magazines.
- Prizes and scholarship for students studying Sanskrit in Institutions.

- Organizing approved Sanskrit Conventions.
- Research in Sanskrit.
- To bring qualitative change in Sanskrit Education.
- Measures to integrate Sanskrit studies with other disciplines like Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Medical Science and Law etc.
- To use new methods of imparting Sanskrit Education with the help of modern tools and technologies.
- Any other activity, which may be found conducive to the enrichment, propagation and development of Sanskrit.

Procedure of Central Schemes



RECEIVE ONLINE APPLICATION FORM: Applicants submit their application through the online portal.

VERIFICATION OF DOCUMENTS: All submitted documents are verified for authenticity and compliance with scheme requirements.

SCRUTINY OF APPLICATIONS: Applications are carefully examined to ensure eligibility and adherence to scheme guidelines.

APPROVAL BY G.I.A.C (GRANT-IN-AID COMMITTEE): The applications are reviewed and approved by the relevant authority or committee for further processing.

PAYMENT RELEASE VIA PFMS/DBT MODE: Once approved, payments are disbursed directly to the beneficiaries via the Public Financial Management System (PFMS) or Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT).

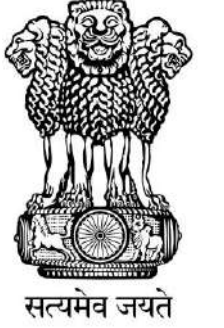

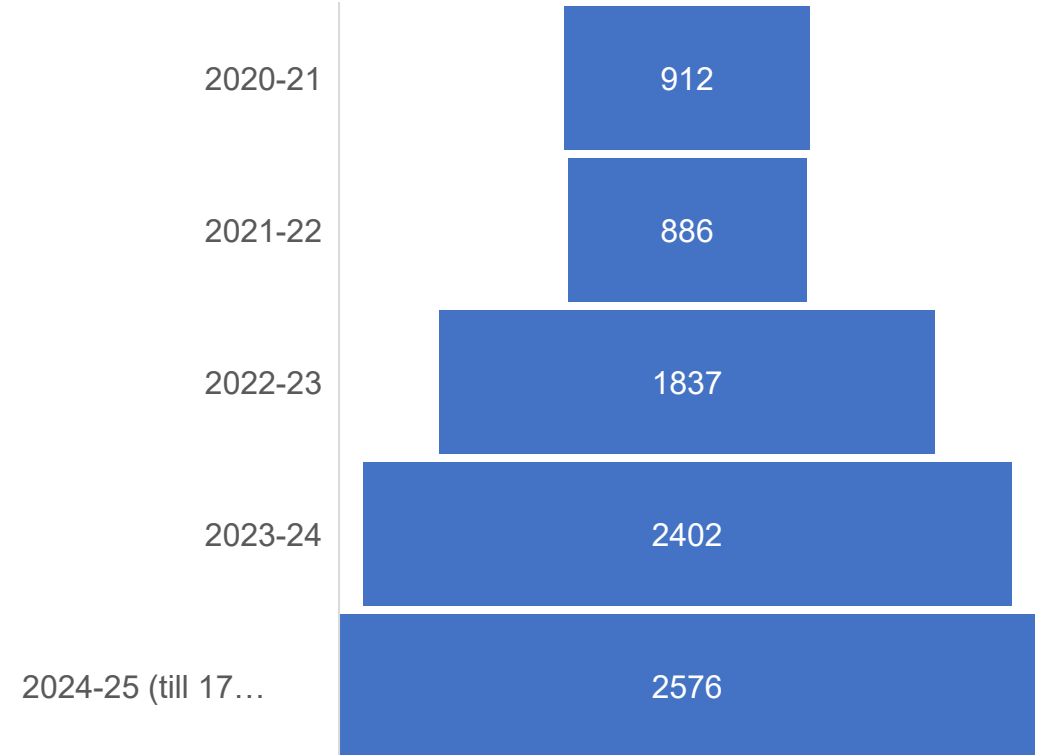
Financial Assistance for Sanskrit Teaching (Teachers for Sanskrit/Modern Subjects)

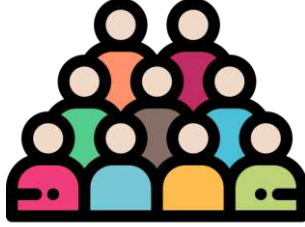

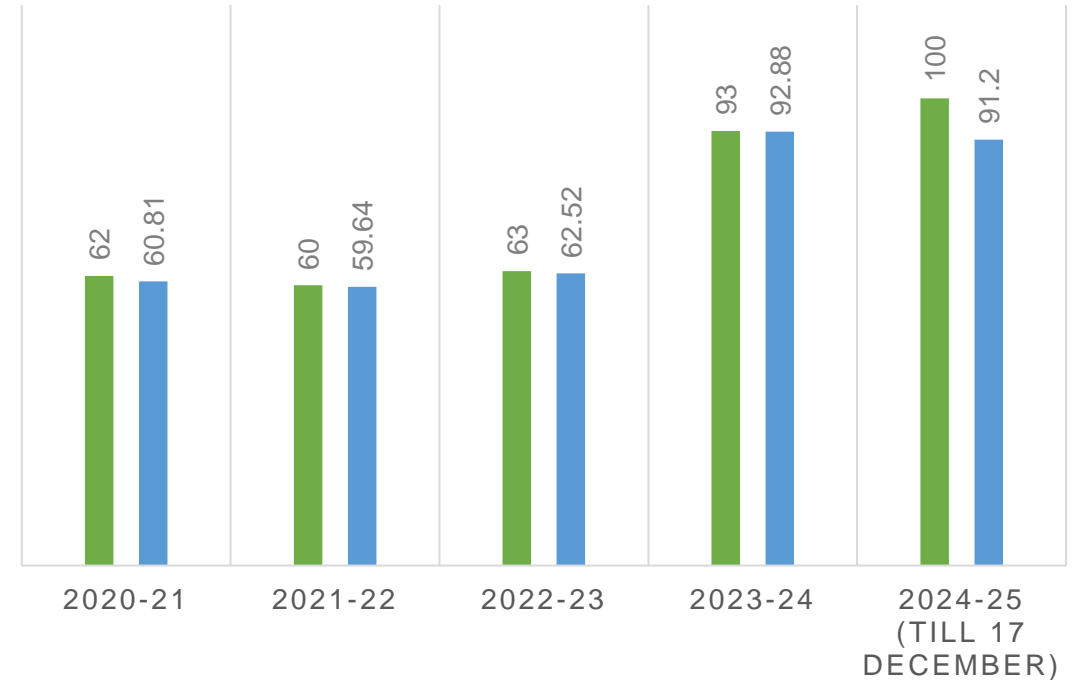


Financial Assistance for Samman Rashi to Eminent Sanskrit Pandits in indigent circumstances

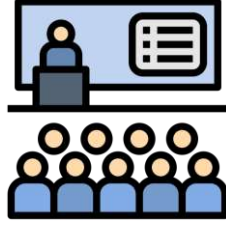

- ❑ Total No. of beneficiaries – 156 Sanskrit Pandits



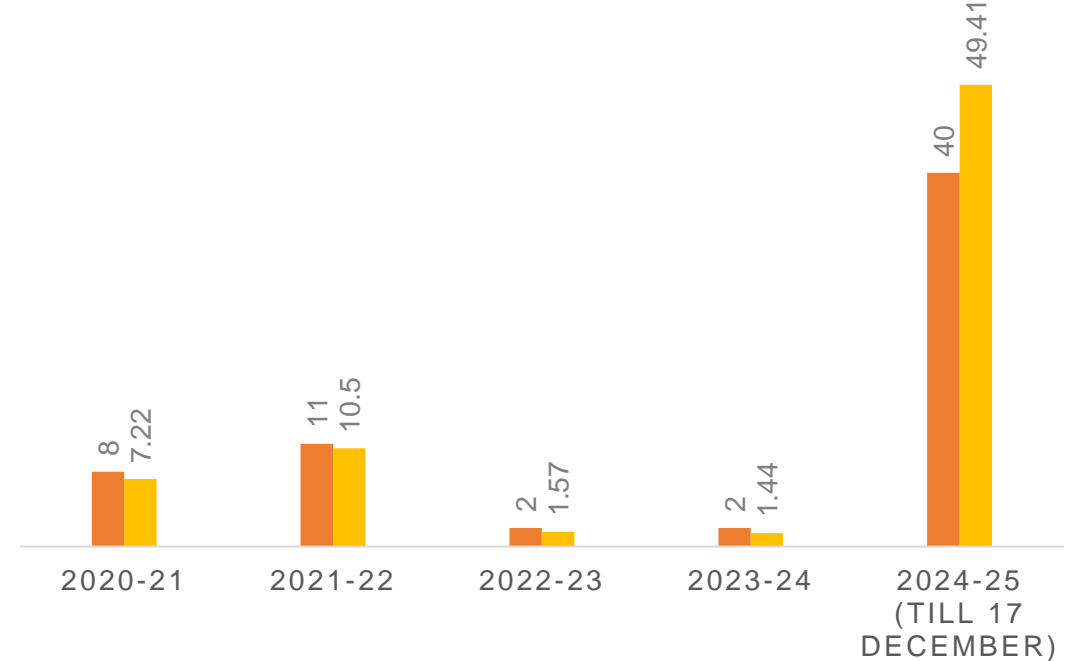

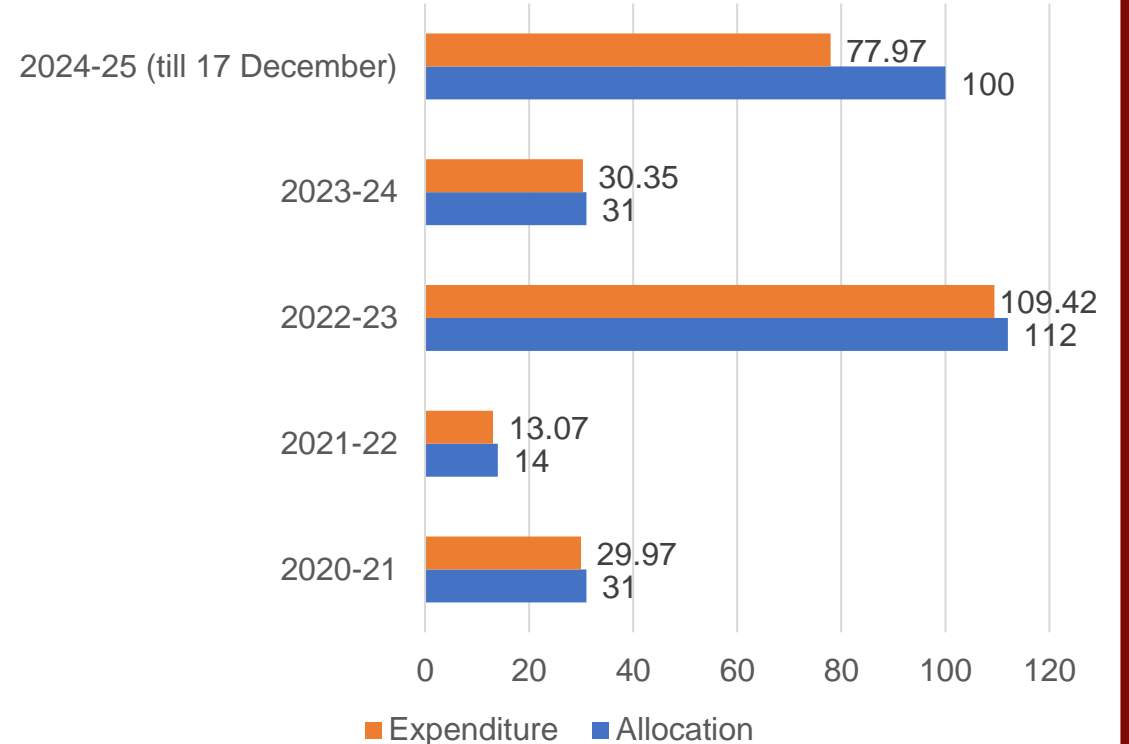


Financial Assistance for Publication/Re-print of rare books and Bulk Purchase of Books



- ❑ Grants are being released for creation of Sanskrit Literature, protection of Sanskrit Journals and Newspapers, printing of rare Sanskrit books, purchase of Bulk Sanskrit books and enrichment of Sanskrit libraries.
- ❑ Total No. of beneficiaries – 654 Sanskrit Publishers, 103 Sanskrit Newspapers/ Journals/ Writers, 788 Sanskrit Libraries/ Institutions, 59884 books are provided to various Institutions .
- ❑ 83 books and 400 rare books have been published in the last five years.

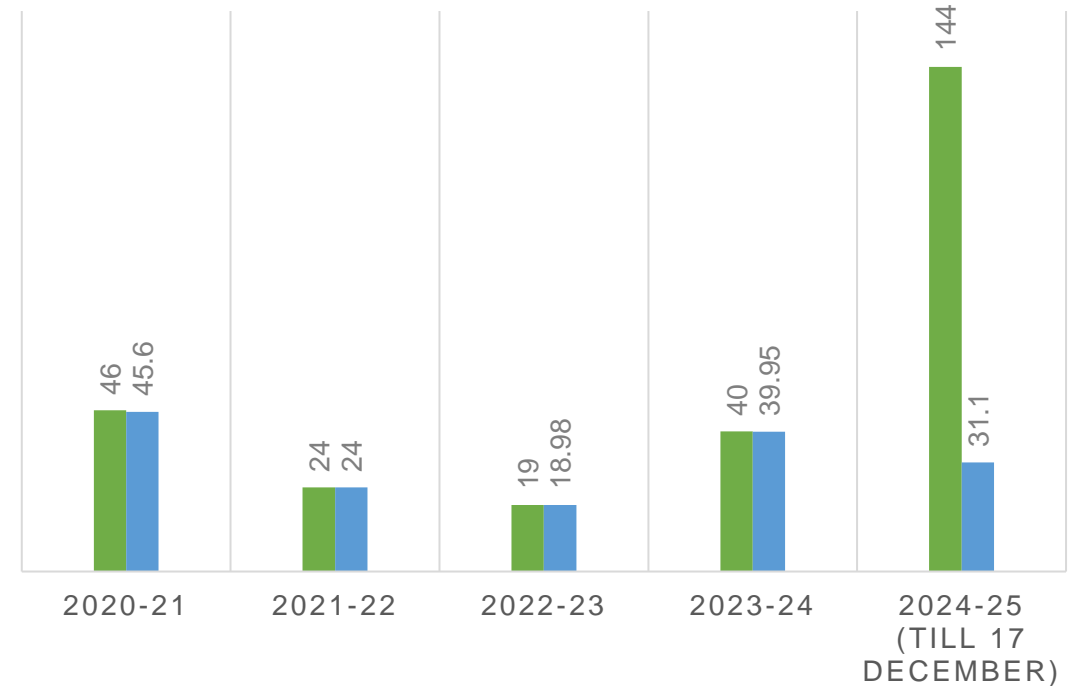
Financial Assistance for Utilization of Services of Eminent or/and Retired Sanskrit Scholars (Shastra Chudamani)

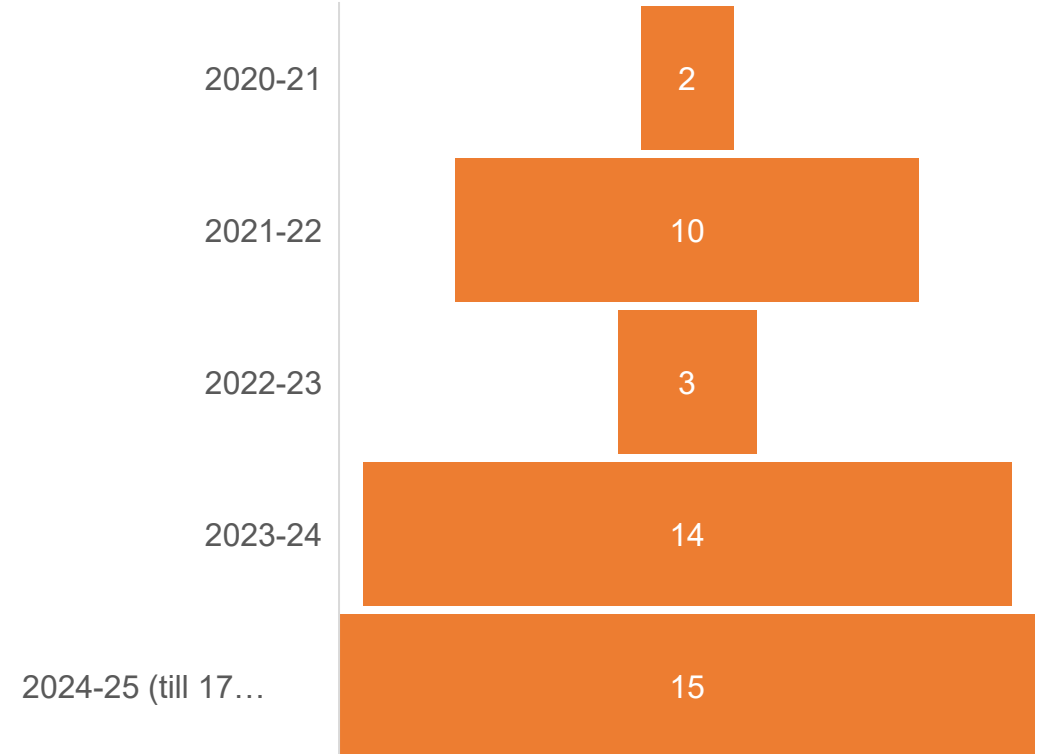


Financial Assistance to Registered Academic Organizations to conduct "Vocational Training Courses to the Students of traditional Sanskrit Pathshalas/Institutions

- ❑ Rs. 1,00,000/- per training course will be provided to eligible Institutions.

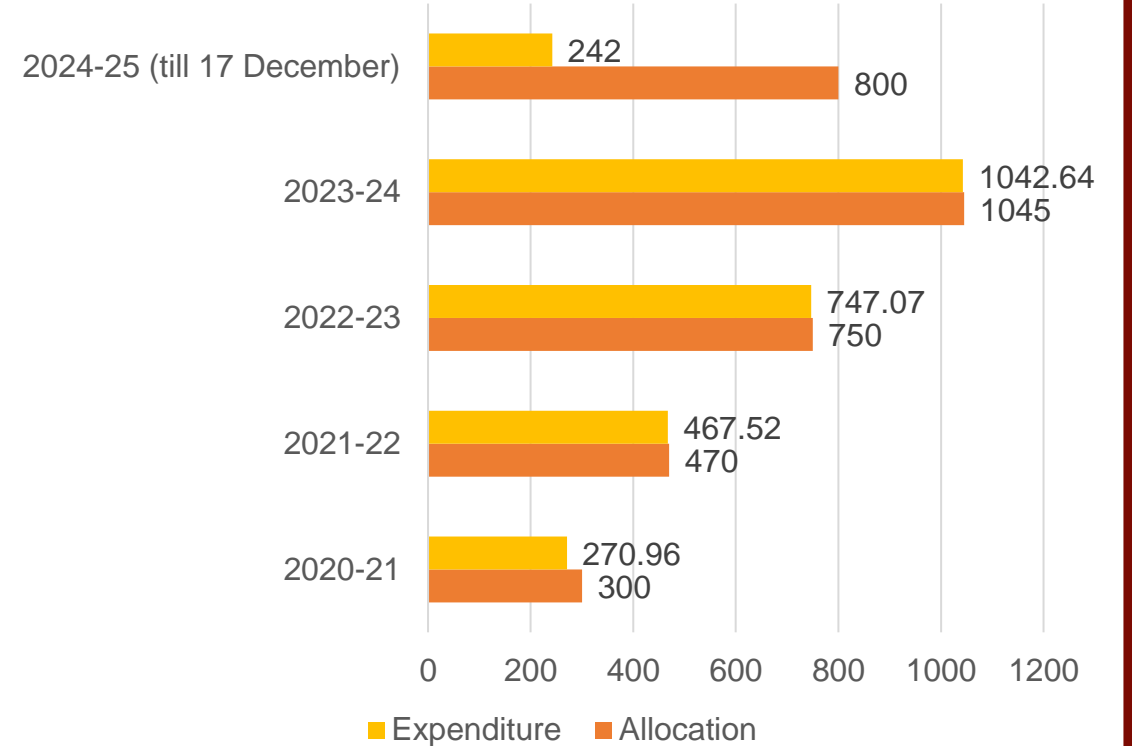

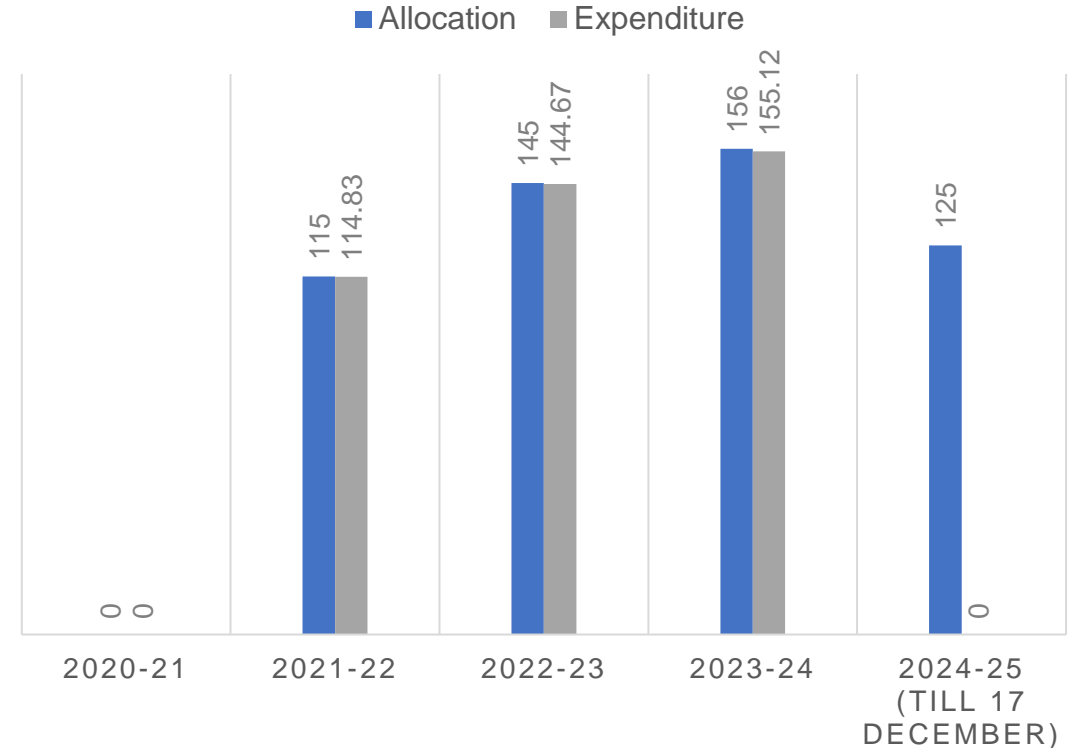


All India Sanskrit Elocution Contest (Akhila Bhartiya Shastreeya Spardha)

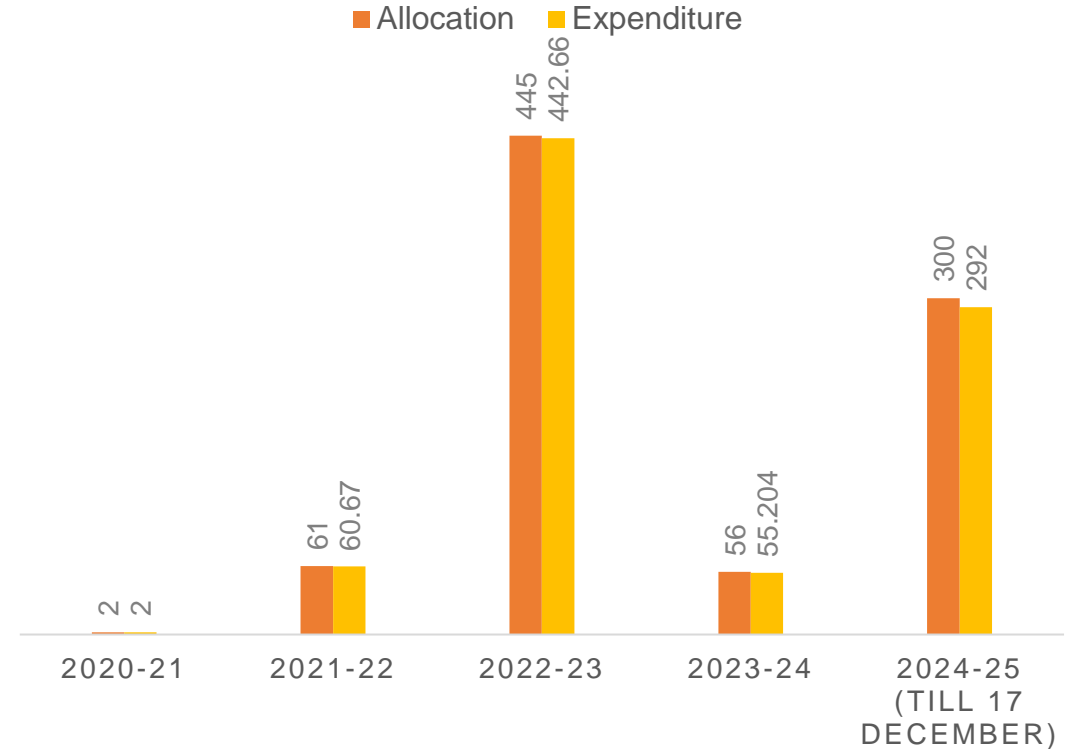


Financial Assistance under the Ashtaadashi - Eighteen Projects for sustaining the growth of Sanskrit

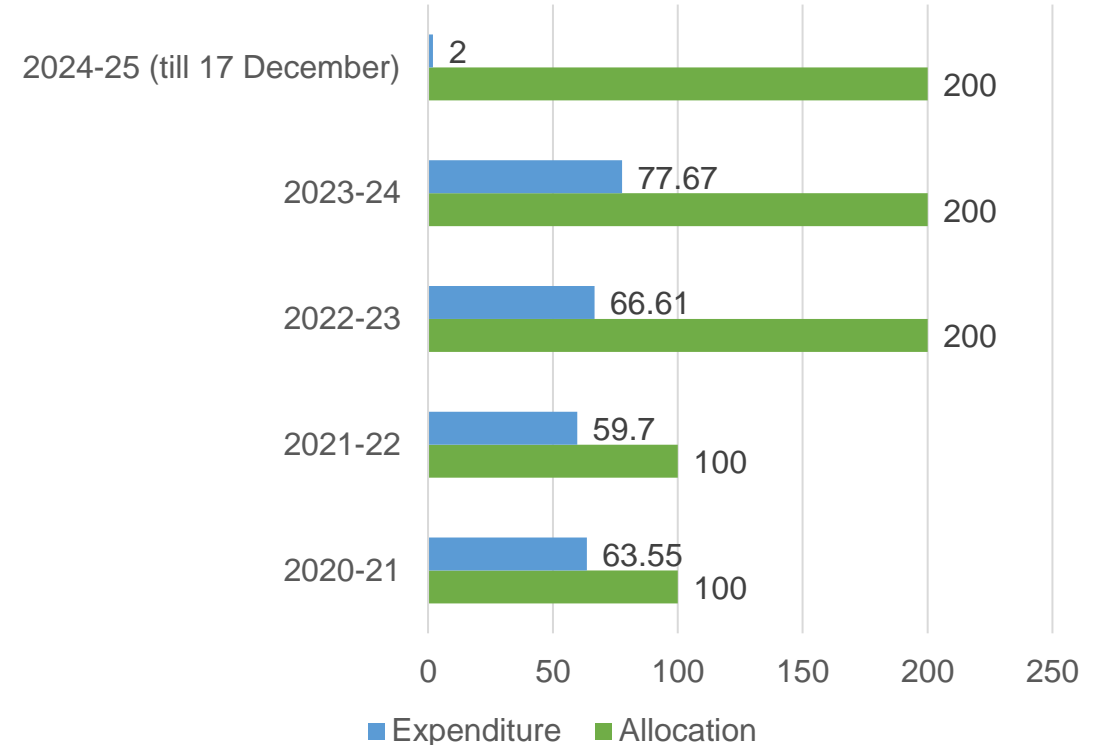
Scheme for Development of Pali and Prakrit Languages

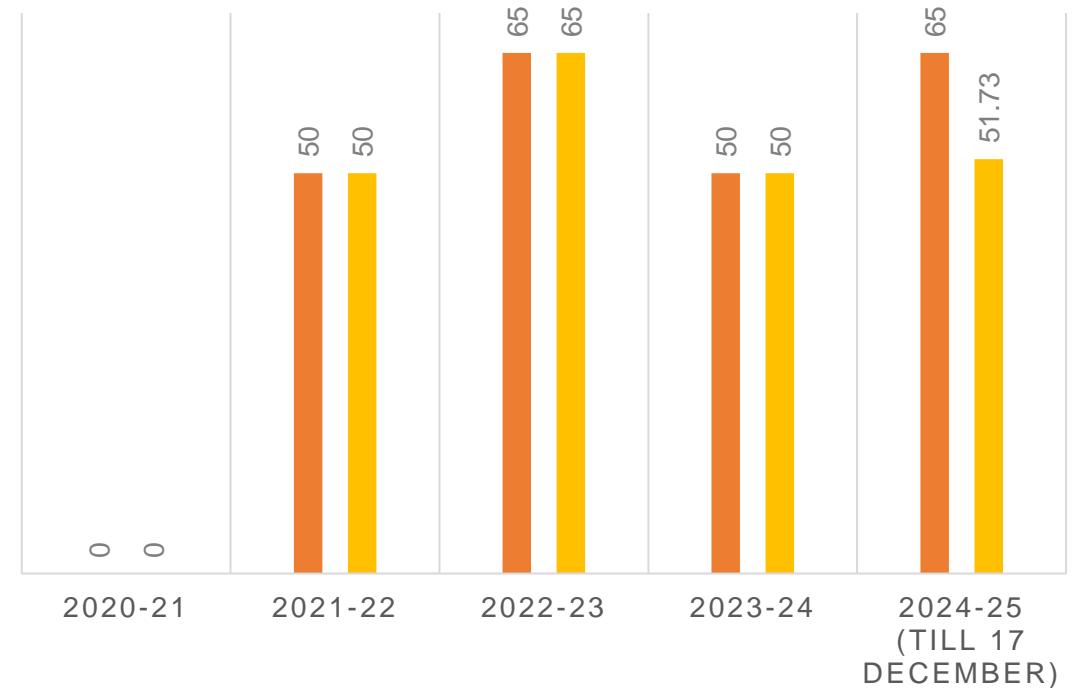
Deccan College Sanskrit Dictionary Project

Centre for Sanskrit Learning (CSL) Process



Eligibility

Any person who have passed 10th standard (Age 16+) is eligible.



Period

A minimum period of 120 hours per programme



Fee

Learners are required to deposit ₹ 500/- for each course through online payment.



Place of Study

The place of study may be within the campus of the Institution / Centre at any nearby place according to the convenience.

The examination of all the enrolled learners of all the study centres related with the main centre will be held in the Main Centre only.

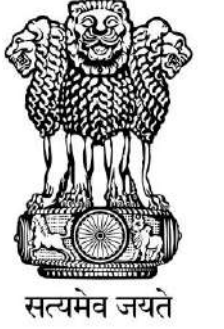

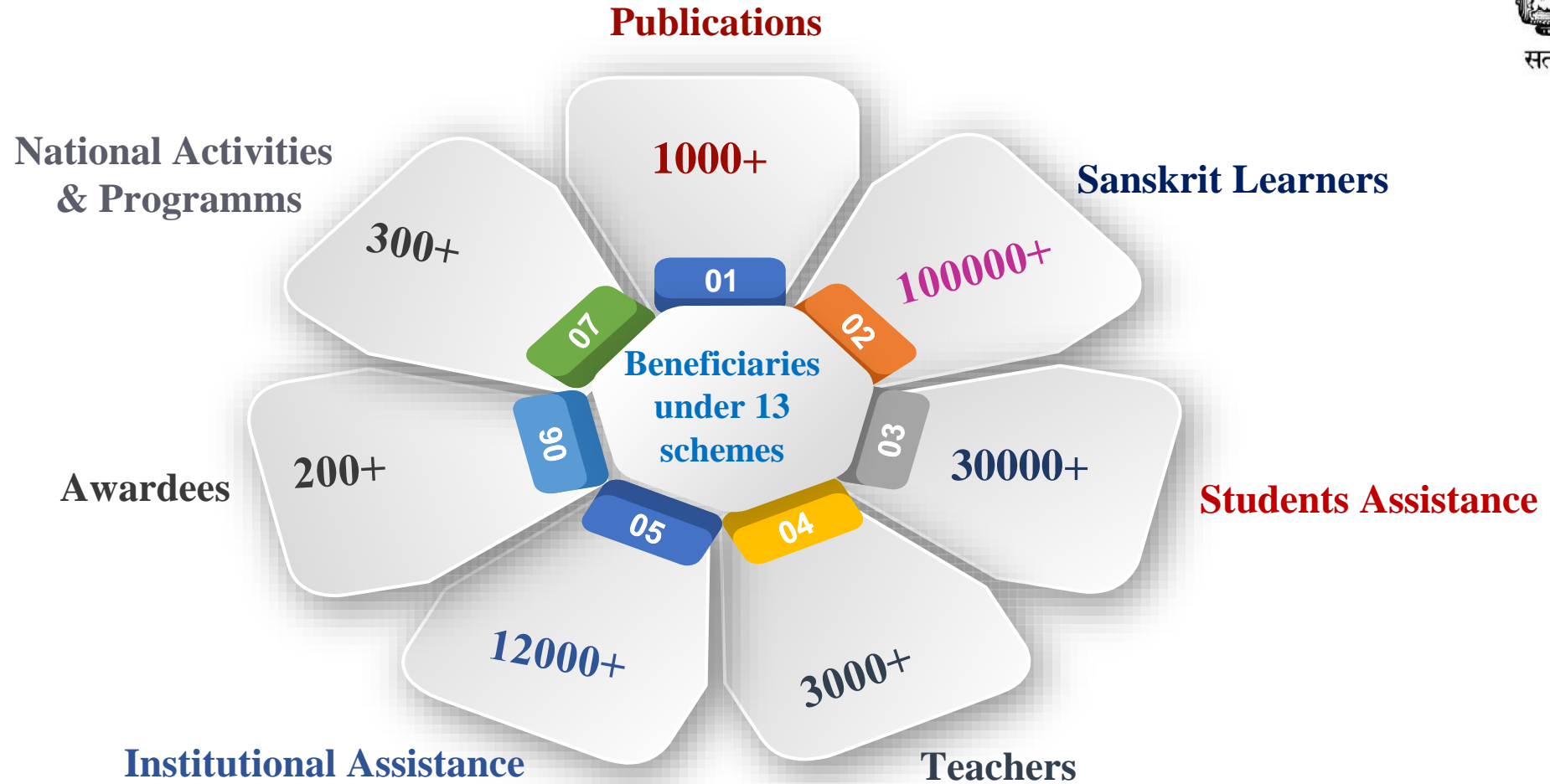

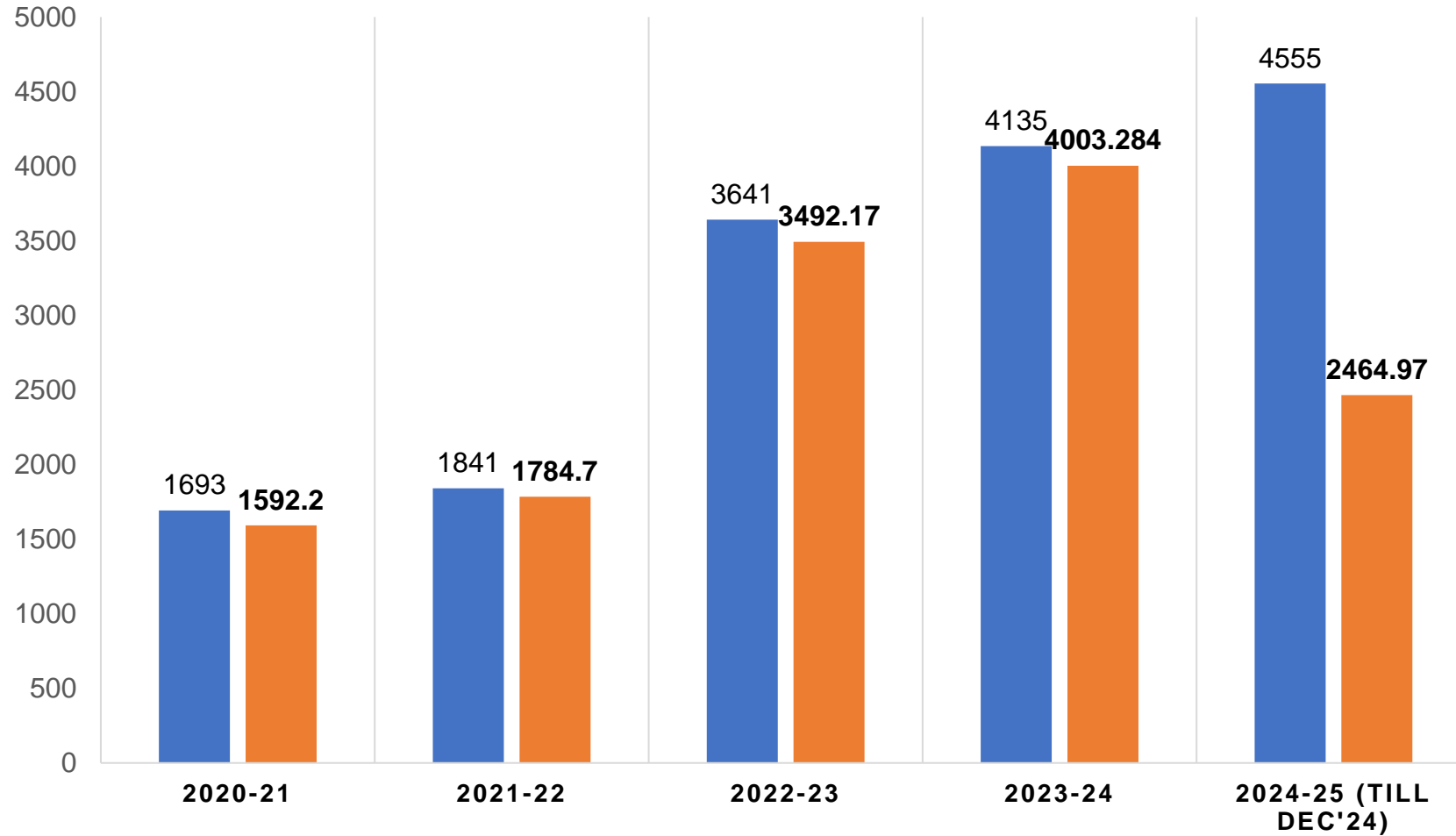




Year-wise Grants & Expenditure
